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Nursery

What a busy week in Nursery! We have been learning all about the number 6. Counting to 6 and looking at how many different ways to make 6.

We read the storybook, *Six-Dinner Sid*. It is about a sleek black cat called Sid who manages to reside at six homes at the same time, receiving all the benefits, including six daily meals!!

We've also been down to the allotment planting onions and feeding the chickens. We even found some frog spawn.

Question: What are the ways to make six?

Reception

A wonderful week in Reception. We have been reading a story called "Zeraffa Giraffa" about a giraffe who travelled from Africa to Paris. The children loved the beautiful illustrations and completed some lovely writing in response to the story. In maths we have been learning about 3D shapes and their names. What names can you remember? In RE we have been focusing on The Easter Story and how we prepare during this time of year. We are looking forward to the final 3 days of the Spring term.

Question: How are 30 shapes different to 20 shapes?

Year 1

Year 1 have had a busy week completing their spring assessments. We are very pleased with all their hard work and the great progress they have made in their Phonics.

The children have also been working on writing a narrative based on the story of Zeraffa Giraffa by Dianne Hofmeyr. The children have linked their stories to our Geography work and taken her on a journey around England.

The children thoroughly enjoyed a Now Press Play session that consolidated their geography learning about the UK. They had to travel by helicopter to all four nations and gather clues to rescue King Charles from the cellar!

In RE the children have been very creative in preparing a station of the cross for us to share in our whole school "Way of the Cross" reflections next week. In RSE this week we focussed on describing and expressing our emotions.

In computing we will continue to practise the skills of dragging and dropping using a trackpad.

The children looked wonderful in their Easter Bonnets - thank you for your continued support.

Question: Can you name the four national flowers?

Year 2

Year 2 have been completing their assessments this week and we are so proud of the children's perseverance and resilience.

In English, we have finished reading our book, 'Pandora', and the children have produced some beautiful pieces of writing this week! They wrote a persuasive letter begging the bird to come back and they wrote detailed setting descriptions explaining how the bird changed Pandora's world.

In Maths, we have been dividing by 2 and solving problems involving this concept. In R.E, we have been explaining the significance of different signs and symbols during Lent. The children have also produced their artwork for the Stations of the Cross and they have been extremely reflective while doing this.

We ended the week with a fantastic celebration sharing our egg-cellent Easter Bonnets!

Question: Name some different signs and symbols of Lent.

Year 3

This week has been assessment week in year 3 and the results have been very good. It is so nice to see that the hard work is being reflected in the scores of the children.

In English this week the children have used the book 'Zeraffa Giraffa' as a stimulus for their learning. Each class in the school has used the book to create their own version of the story. The conversations and ideas in Year 3 were brilliant and the stories that have been created are excellent!

In math, alongside our assessments/testing, we have continued to focus on mass. We have added and subtracted mass as well as reading scales to solve problems.

In RE we have completed our reconciliation part of the sacramental programme ready to begin our communion preparation after the break. In our RE lessons we have also worked on bible stories such as 'The Garden of Gethsemane' and the parable of 'The Prodigal Son'.

Year 4

Year Four have worked really hard this week, completing a number of assessments and producing some lovely work about Lent.

As we approach Holy Week, the children have been reflecting on their Lenten promises and learning about Palm Sunday. We read the story, studied the scripture and considered the meaning behind the symbols of Palm Sunday. 4DS have also been preparing for their assembly next week in which they will focus on the Easter story.

In English, the whole school have been using the book 'Zeraffa Giraffa' to inspire their writing. The book is based on the true events of a journey to transport a giraffe from South Sudan to Paris. Year Four researched some of the places that the giraffe could have travelled through and wrote their own story about the things they saw and the experiences they had.

Question: What are the symbols of Palm Sunday?

Year 5

Year 5 deserve a lot of praise for all their hard work and determination this week. In maths, we have completed 3 assessments which have evidenced the amazing determination and progress across the last term.

Like much of the school, we have explored the book 'Zeraffa Giraffa' in English and have written imaginative and engaging pieces that recount the journey of an animal from Egypt to Europe.

Each class have used their artistic ability to create beautiful pieces that depict one of the stations of the cross. The children have really enjoyed making their pieces and are looking forward to viewing every classes' during our prayer trail on Monday.

It was so amazing to see 5DW's class assembly, it was clear to see the hard work that they had put into it.

Questions: Which landmarks did Zeraffa see on his journey to France?

Year B

We've been working extremely hard in Year 6 this week!

We started the week by completing and publishing our double page spreads on Len Johnson. The children have been thoroughly engaged whilst learning about the life of Len Johnson and have been inspired by the work he did with regards to equality. We spent the later half of the week focusing on our whole school text, 'Zeraffa Giraffa'. We explored how animals were often given as gifts through history and discussed if we thought this was right.

In Maths, we completed our unit of work on ratio. We explored how we can use multiplication and division knowledge to help us to scale recipes up or down. We have started our new unit of work on algebra this week and the children are enthused and excited to learn more!

Our RE focus has been regarding the season of Lent. We have explored and discussed images often associated with Lent and make links between them.

Question: What animals did Queen Elizabeth II receive during her reign?
