

Reception

What a lovely way to end our third half term in Reception at St. Stephen's. This week we have been so busy having lots of fun learning time. We innovated our story of "Handa's Surprise" and added descriptions of the animals. We then retold our new version in our own words. In maths, we have thought about doubling numbers and subitising with larger numbers. Subitising is tricky so we will definitely keep practising. We welcomed Father into class on Wednesday where we received our ashes. We thought about the things we are sorry for and reflected on this special day. In RE we enjoyed our "Be a Light" afternoon where we made candles to represent Jesus, we also had a wonderful forest school session where Mrs Artingstall planned lots of "light" activities for us to take part in. On Friday, we learnt about the importance of staying safe in the water. We also created honey labels for a competition.

We are honestly so proud of the children and how much they have grown and developed so far. As we start the second half of the academic year, the children will be starting to get ready for Year 1. We are really excited! Have a lovely half term.

Year 1

What an amazing half term we have had in Year 1, we are so proud of all the children's progress and efforts!

This week, we have been writing our own story narrative in English using our Man on the Moon text. In Maths, we have been continuing our work on doubles, and using near doubles to help with addition and subtraction. During RE we have been talking about Lent, and making our own Lenten promises. The children were extremely respectful and sensible during our Ash Wednesday mass and enjoyed receiving their ashes. In History, we have continued our Flight topic, and have been learning all about the Wright brothers, and their invention of the first powered aeroplane. Today, we have celebrated Water Safety day, and have been learning about how to stay safe near water.

We hope you have a lovely half term and look forward to welcoming the children back.

Year 2

We have had a great final week of this half term. How time has flown by!

In English this week, we have used our research about different birds to create a non chronological report. We then published them into some beautiful leaflets.

In Maths, we have been exploring shape. Throughout our lessons we have been consolidating our knowledge of shape names from year one. We have then been exploring the number of sides and vertices of a shape, as well as considering the definition of a polygon.

In Science this week, we have been looking carefully at sustainability. We have considered how plastic can be both helpful and harmful.

This then links to our Geography unit. We have started to name and locate the 5 oceans of the world and will later explore how to keep our oceans clean.

We ended our week continuing our story seekers programme.

We also had a water safety themed afternoon where we looked at different hazard close to natural water sources (including seas and oceans).

Year 3

An incredibly busy week in Year 3!

In English the children worked very hard on planning and writing a biography of Greta Thunberg. We looked at the similarities and differences between last week's story book called 'Greta and the Giants' and this week's non-fiction text all about Greta's life.

In Maths, we worked on multiplying two digit numbers by a one digit number using partitioning. The children solved a range of different problems using the method they learnt. Many of the children also got certificates for their 8 times table recall.

In RE we started to talk about Lent and its importance. On Ash Wednesday, we enjoyed a lovely mass and received ashes.

In History, we have looked at the city states of Ancient Greece, in particular those of Athens and Sparta. The children had to explain the differences in the way the societies of these two countries worked and how they were ruled.

Year 4

What a week! Year 4 have worked incredibly hard this week.

In English we have reached the end of our text `*The miraculous journey of Edward Tulane'*. The children have had a go at being authors themselves and writing their own continuous chapter from the text.

In Maths we have been revisiting perimeter and looking at corresponding units of measure. The children have grasped the concept of kilometers, meters, centimeters and millimeters really well and worked hard mastering their skills.

We have now come to the end of our Geography unit about rivers, we have had some very interesting discussions about pollution, flooding and why rivers are important to us. After the half term, we will be moving on to our history topic all about `*The Anglo Saxons and Vikings*' which, I am sure, the children are really looking forward to.

Newsletter

Year 5

Another busy week here in Year 5! The children have not let the half term approaching slow them down. In Maths, we have been continuing our unit on Multiplication and Division whereby the children have been using area models to support them in multiplying 2-digit numbers by 2-digit numbers. We extended this further using the formal written method to multiply 3-digit numbers by 2-digit numbers. When we return from the half term, we will begin using multiplication to solve problem questions and introduce division methods.

Understanding the journey of Maudie and Arthur in our Brightstorm novel has brought us to analyse features of newspaper reports in English this week. To do this, we began comparing two articles reporting on the Brightstorm expedition disaster, analysing the features, orientations and effectiveness of each.

On Wednesday, Year 5 had their trip to Jodrell Bank. It was a fantastic experience where the children explored the exhibitions, listened to talks, explored the interactive learning sites and enjoyed a fantastic show in the Space Dome. The children were very enthusiastic and extremely well behaved on the trip and we are very proud of them!

This week, we have begun to practice our Passion Play, in preparation for our performance next half term. The children have received their scripts and it would be great if they could practice over half term in preparation for our next lot of rehearsals in the first week back.

We hope all children and families have a lovely half term break and get some well deserved rest. We look forward to welcoming you back on Monday 26th February 2024.

Year 6

This week has flown by in Year 6! The children have been working extremely hard in all aspects of the curriculum this week.

In Maths, we have now completed our unit on algebra with the children now able to solve two-step and two-variable equations.

We have focused on summarising in English and have summarised main events within different chapters of our text, 'The House with Chicken Legs'. The children have further analysed Marinka's character and considered her emotions at different points in the story.

On Wednesday, we attended Ash Wednesday Mass. When we returned to school, we shared our Lenten promises and created crosses to remind us that we are all journeying together through Lent.

Last week, the children started bringing home their new homework books. Each week, the children will be set a test from each book to complete at home. We will then mark these together as a class and discuss the answers.

We hope that all the children and families in Year 6 have a wonderful half term break and we look forward to welcoming the children back at 8.20am for Boosters on Monday 26th February.
