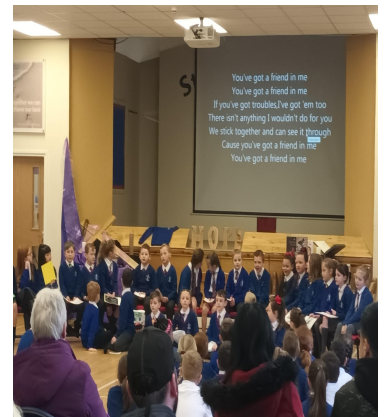
Year 5DM and Y3CS

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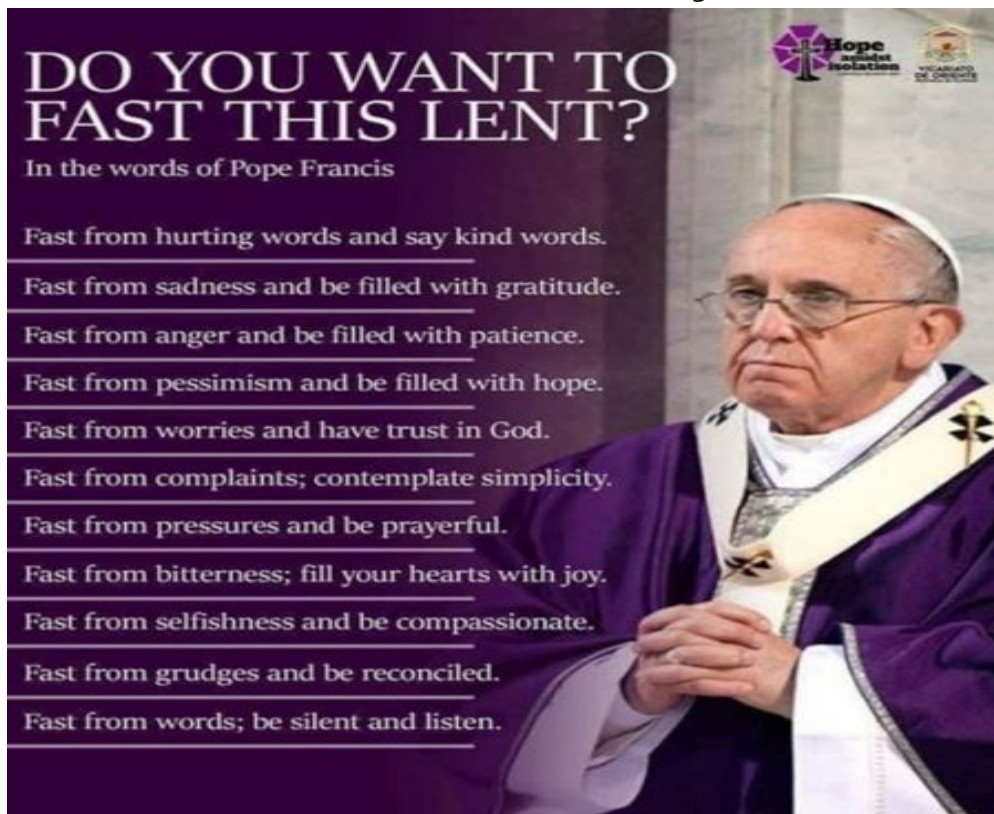

Nursery

What an exciting week we have had! First of all, we had a visitor to nursery, Jasper the cat. He brought his book, Jasper's Beanstalk, so we have been retelling the story and exploring planting. During our allotment visit on Wednesday, we all planted seeds to grow in the greenhouse. We have been drawing beanstalks and listening for the first sound in words too.

Reception

This week we have started our learning based on the story Lulu Loves Flowers. We have enjoyed listening attentively to the story. We have been working on asking and answering questions related to the story. We have looked at different types of flowers and discovered that they all have a special name. We have also been learning the names of different parts of a flower.

The children have been busy outside preparing the soil for planting. We have also planted our own sunflower seed and understand what we must do to help it grow.

In mathematics we continue to explore the composition of number. We are also beginning to identify numerals above 10.

Year 1

We have had a great week of learning in year one this week! In English, we have written character descriptions and tried to use the suffixes 'ed' and 'ing' in our writing. We have been adding numbers within 20 using our number bonds and number lines in maths.

The children have been thinking about ways we can change during Lent and making a conscious effort to apply these changes. In Geography, we named and identified the countries of the UK on a map. We also went on a lovely spring walk to look at the changes that happen during this season.

Question of the week: What are the four countries of the UK?

Year 2

An exciting week for Year 2! On Thursday, the children took part in the ProStrike Speed Challenge. Each child had three shots at a goal with their speed displayed in a digital screen for their classmates to see. They all had a fantastic time and in doing so have raised an enormous amount of money for our school - thank you for your sponsorship and support!

Alongside this, lots of hard work has been taking place. In English, the children have produced some great work around our text, Pandora, and they wrote some beautiful letters persuading the bird to come back. In Maths, we have been deepening our understanding of fractions and we have been recognising and finding $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{4}$ and $\frac{1}{3}$ of amounts. In R.E, the children have been looking at the order of Mass and explaining what happens at different parts. We have been continuing our Lenten journey and thinking about what promises we can make during this special time.

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Year 3

Another wonderful week in Year 3! 3CS/DH performed a superb class assembly on Wednesday, we celebrated Mass with year 1 on Thursday and the children completed their sponsored penalty challenge. In addition to these, we have continued our learning around George's Marvellous Medicine in English. We read and analysed chapters 3 and 4, created character profiles of Grandma and George and wrote our own instructions for a marvellous medicine. In Maths, we have moved on to calculating fractions of an amount and the addition and subtraction of fractions with the same denominator. As part of our listening and sharing unit in RE, we read and answered questions about the story 'Stone Soup', as well as explaining how a variety of people prepare for Mass, the Priest, Altar Servers, Readers, Eucharistic Ministers and ourselves. Next week, we are looking forward to our RE retreats with Mrs Farmer on Tuesday and Wednesday, as well as 3LW's assembly at 9.10am on Wednesday morning.

Question - Why is it important to prepare for Mass?

Year 4

In Year 4 this week we have been thinking about Lent and the importance of self-reflection at this time of the church's year. We wrote prayers asking God to guide us on our Lenten journey.

In Maths, we continued to look at fractions. The children are becoming experts at changing mixed numbers to improper fractions and vice versa. We also looked at adding and subtracting fractions.

In English we are still enjoying our wordless picture book, 'Journeys'. It is amazing to hear the children's ideas about what might be happening as they interpret each image.

On Thursday we were very excited to take part in the 'pro strike' activity. The children had three shots at the goals and scored some very fast times.

Question: What is 2 as an improper fraction?



Year 5

This week in Year 5 has been another full of learning and hard work. In English we have moved on in the story of Chak de India and have planned our own newspaper articles focused on a match within the story. These reports will be constructed next week. In Maths, we have completed our division unit and will be moving onto fractions next.

In Science we have had a really exciting week, looking at the specific parts of a plant and dissecting a lily. In RE we have begun our next unit, 'Memorial Sacrifice'. We have thought about our most personal and cherished memories and how we can keep them alive forever. We really enjoyed the football charity event on Thursday and it was great cheering on each other in year 5.

Year 6

Year 6 have been completing some extremely challenging work this week in maths! We have been converting fractions to decimals and also multiplying and dividing fractions! The children have loved the challenge and are fraction experts! In English, we have continued to read White Bird however, there will be no spoilers! We have read extracts of Anne Frank's diary within our English lessons to help us learn more about what hiding would have been like for our main Character, Sara.

In RE, we have thought about how St Paul's Letters give us advice. We have reflected upon how this advice can enrich our lives. We also considered whether world leaders should use this scripture whilst making decisions.

Question: What is special about $\frac{2}{3}$ when it is converted to a decimal?

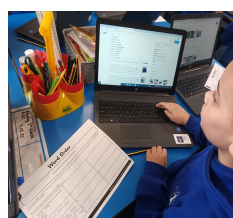
