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Nursery

This week in Nursery, we extended the story of Wow said the Owl. We all drew something else that we thought Owl would like to see during the daytime. The children used the repeated phrase from the book to include their own ideas. When at the allotment, we went on a colour search! With a friend, the children loved searching for plants, flowers, fruit and objects of different colours. They worked together and took turns to tick off on their clipboard. We also went on a hedgehog hunt in the forest. We thought about different places that nocturnal animals may go to sleep during the day. In Mathematics, we have continued to work on our careful counting skills, slowing down and touching each object as we count.

Reception

In Reception this week we have continued to read "Room on the Broom." We have focused on the structure of the story and can say what happens at the beginning, middle and the end. We have also started to use language to describe the characters. We are really enjoying delving deeper into the story. In maths we have been focusing on positional language. We have been putting out St Stephens bear in different places and describing where he is: "he is on the chair" "he is under the table."

We really enjoyed our "Riddle of the Sphynx" session on Wednesday. Dr Colorado Smith was so cool and we loved our time with him. We are really developing into great mathematicians!

Near 1

Another very busy week for Year 1! As part of Maths week, we took part in an exciting "Riddle of the Sphinx" workshop, where children applied different mathematical concepts and worked together to make different shapes out of their bodies. We continue with addition in our usual maths lessons using part-whole models, and have introduced the concept of subtraction. In English this week, we have been generating adjectives to describe the characters from our story 'Supertato', before putting them into sentences. Some children have been using 'and' to join two clauses. In our Geography topic, we have identified different types of weather and matched them to the correct symbols. In R.E, some children shared pictures of their own baptism with the class. We then discussed the rituals of baptism and matched these to the correct images. In Computing, we have used the shape and line tools to create a piece of artwork in the style of Piet Mondrian. For our Music lesson this week, we have started practicing songs for our carol service. The children continue to work hard to complete their weekly challenges- well done! Completed challenges have been sent home as usual.

Question- Ask your child about their challenges.

Year 2

We have had a great week this week in Year 2.

During Maths week, we have been continuing with our Mastery Maths sessions and the children have enjoyed finding generalisations surrounding odd and even numbers. We have also been looking closely at known number facts and working out other related facts we can find.

On Wednesday, the children thoroughly enjoyed the Riddle of the Sphinx workshop. Here we looked at multiplication, word problems and finding different possibilities. We are proud of how the children showed resilience during the task. They also explored different shapes and how to make them.

We have also been working through our levels on Numbots to help us with our fluency in Maths.

In Science, we have been continuing to look at how exercise impacts our bodies. We completed an experiment considering heart rate and different exercises.

In Music this week, we have started to learn some of the songs for our Christmas performance. Mrs Grantham has been working hard to teach us all the choreography to accompany the songs.

In RE, we have studied the sacrament of Baptism and explored different signs and symbols along with their meanings.

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Year 3

This week has been a fun filled maths week with a range of different activities. In class, we have now completed our addition and subtraction unit and moved onto our final autumn unit of multiplying and dividing. In our 'Riddle of the Sphinx' workshop, our focus was on time. The children had to solve time problems in class to complete our part of the riddle. The children have also spent a large amount of time on TT-Rockstars earning coins for our school.

In our Guided Reading this week, we have looked at texts linked to our English book 'The Dark'. We have read a short story named 'Smoot' and also a poem called 'The Shadow'. The children have really enjoyed responding to the questions.

In Science we have looked at the muscles and joints in our bodies and how they work. We then moved onto working on how our body uses nutrients to keep us healthy.

In Geography this week we have analysed the different layers of our planet.

Question- What are the 4 layers on planet Earth?

Year 4

Another varied and exciting week in Year 4. Maths Week saw Year 4 looking at shape and perimeter. In our workshop for 'The Riddle of the Sphinx', the children had to make a range of perfect 2D shapes with cones. Team work was of vital importance and the children did a great job of supporting one another. In class, they had to choose the right path to take to prevent the Doctor falling into the Snake Pit. This was a tricky problem as they had to work out the perimeters of three paths. The children worked hard and found the correct answers.

This week we have begun our new English unit which is based on the book 'A Christmas Carol.' We have looked a little at the background of the story and talked about the contrasts in society which were so evident at that time. We looked at an extract from the original work to get a clear picture of the character of Scrooge.

In Art the children were excited to begin their creation of an Egyptian Death Mask. We have looked carefully at the death mask of Tutankhamun and are recreating that design using papier mache.

Question: What other stories did Charles Dickens write?

Year 5

Maths Week has been amazing! The children have participated in Maths challenges all week, showing enthusiasm, interest and resilience. On Monday, we were challenged to solve a range of mathematical problems in our webinar.

To solve the 'Riddle of the Sphinx' on Wednesday, we used formulae to convert imperial measurements to metric in our workshop with Dr Colarado Smith, as well as exploring regular polygons.

In class, we explored spirals in nature. We learnt about concentric circles, as well as the circumference, diameter and radius of a circle. We then investigated Archimedean,

Baravelle and Fibonacci spirals, using spirals in our artwork.

Throughout the week, we have continued our novel 'Room 13' in English. We used images of Whitby Abbey to write simple, compound and complex sentences. We also learned about the features of emails and explored the 'pros' and 'cons' of using emails to communicate.

To top off the week, 5LW won the 'England Rocks' Class Challenge on TTRS, whilst Eddie Turner won the individual challenge. We can't wait to enjoy our prize!

Year B

Wow! We have absolutely loved Maths Week in Year 6. We've been lucky enough to participate in a range of mathematical activities and experiences. We began the week with an engaging webinar where we had to solve a range of mathematical problems in groups. On Wednesday, we solved the 'Riddle of the Sphinx' in a workshop where we learnt about shape and measure with a focus on volume. Yesterday, we participated in a Now Press Play experienced in which we had to use mental maths skills to solve a mystery. We have even explored how Maths can be used to create art by using multiplication and line knowledge. It has been a great week!

In Guided Reading we continued our mathematical theme and read two biographical texts about Alan Turing and Katherine Johnson. We discussed the prejudice both mathematicians faced and their amazing achievements in relation to mathematics. We have continued reading Letters from the Lighthouse in English this week. We have been using evidence from the text to answer questions about the characters and we have started looking at how dialogue can be used to move a story forwards.

Question: How would you solve the volume of a cube or a cuboid?
