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
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## Religious Education

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## Nursery

We have had another fabulous Week in nursery. We have started to practise our class assembly for next Wednesday - we can't wait for you to come and see it. We have been looking at the number 3 again this week. We have been learning how 3 is made up and how we can represent it. We have been throwing bean bags in hoops and seeing what score we get out of 3. It has been lots of fun. We have also looked at the story of The Three Little Pigs.

We have been talking about all different kinds of jobs this and we have been asking the children what they want to do when they grow up. It has been mental health week in school so we have been doing a of relaxation activities such as breathing, peer massage and yoga. Our theme this Friday has been be kind.

## Reception

A lovely week in Reception this week. Thank you to everyone who came to watch both class assemblies. We are so proud of the children, it was so lovely to see them show off their fantastic learning. Well done, Reception! In Literacy, we have thought about how our phonics lessons can help us when we are writing on our own We are getting really good at applying our knowledge. In maths, we have been thinking about pairs and odd ones out.

Can you think of any pairs?

In RE we have read the bible story "Mary and Joseph took Jesus to the Temple." We thought about the different things that give us light and why light is important.

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## Year 1

The children have produced some lovely work across the curriculum this week and have enjoyed our activities to promote Mental Health Awareness. In Maths we have been developing our addition skills within 20 and have been using our number bonds to support our calculations. Keep practising these at home to help improve your child's fluency. In English we use our Man on the Moon book as stimulus to write a character description of an alien. We have also been working hard on our cursive handwriting and presentation skills. In RE we have been listening to stories from the bible - The Presentation and Jesus' being lost in the Temple - the children have been re telling these stories. On Tuesday we took part in Safer Internet Day and the children considered safe use of their technology and how to share things that concern them. We completed our art topic on Henri Matisse and the children practised all the skills we have learned to create beautiful still life paintings. In history we found out about canals in the past.

## Year 2

This week the children have had yet another busy week. In Maths, we have continued to explore shape. We have considered the properties of 2d shapes and found lines of symmetry using mirrors. In English, we have analysed the poem 'Wings' by Pie Corbett. The children have highlighted poetic devices from the poem, completed a reading comprehension about it and started to plan their own version named, 'If I Had Fins'. Both classes this week have also had the pleasure of being taught by Mrs Farmer during our RE retreat afternoons. The children considered friendship; completed a guided meditation and thought carefully about what makes a good friend. As it has been Children's Mental Health Week this week, the children have completed some work about what makes them happy and read stories which helps them to reflect upon the feelings that they have. We also learnt a dance to the song, 'We're all in this together' which we shared with the rest of the school. In Science, we have been considering the definition of a life cycle and looked at the different stages during the life of a butterfly. Finally, In Geography, we have recapped the names and locations of our oceans and considered why our oceans are so important to us.

**Question: Why are our oceans important?**

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## Year 3

This week in Year 3 we have promoted Mental Health Week alongside Internet Safety. Our guided reading sessions have been based on stories that promote Internet safety. The children have been able to produce very sensible and mature responses to the questions posed.

In English the children have written a detailed character description of the Minotaur before producing persuasive writing from the viewpoint of the Minotaur.

In maths we have been comparing units of measure. We have been problem solving using cm, mm and m. We have also been measuring our long jumps in cm and looking at the link between the distance jumped and the heights of the children.

In History we have looked at the history of women in the Olympic Games from the original games in Ancient Greece. The children have researched different elements of the treatment of women in regard to their participation in these Ancient Games.

In Art the children have sketched images linked to the topic of Ancient Greece. 3DM have sketched a Greek Temple where as 3LH have sketched a drawing of the 'Minotaur'.

Questions- What happened to married women if they were caught inside the area watching the Ancient Greek games? What was the winner awarded in the original Ancient Olympic Games?

## Year 4

In Year Four this week, we have celebrated Children's Mental Health Week and Safer Internet Day. Throughout the week, the children took part in activities that would help to promote positive mental health. With the theme of the week being 'Let's Connect', we finished the week with a whole school dance party. In secret this week, we have all been practising a dance to 'We're All In This Together' from High School Musical. On Friday, we all came together to share what we had been working on. The children had an amazing time!

For Safer Internet Day, the children worked in groups to design a game concept to raise awareness about being safe online. Their ideas were so creative and they really enjoyed designing avatars and creating a storyline.

In Maths, we began learning the short division method to help us divide numbers with remainders. Being that it is a tricky concept, we will be spending next week on this too.

In English, we have been writing a report for the school newspaper. The report is based on research we have been doing into life in big towns and cities. The aim of our writing is to persuade the citizens of Droylsden to help create a greener town for us all to enjoy.

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## Year 5

Another busy week for Year 5. This week was Children's Mental Health Week so the children have had fun dancing and completing Taskmaster challenges, such as making their best rainbow, foraging materials for self-portraits and designing their own games.

Tuesday marked Internet Safety Day. For this, the children looked at the implications of posting personal information online and created a poster to warn of the dangers.

In English, the children continued to enjoy their unit on Chak De! India, which included exploring the informal letters and planning their own informal letter.

We continued to deepen our knowledge of multiplication in maths; experimenting with short and long multiplication to solve complex problems. The children excelled in this vital skill which will be useful through their journey in education.

**Question: The journey from Manchester to London is 212 miles. How many miles would you travel in 12 journeys?**

## Year 6

Year 6 have had another busy week! In Maths, we have been looking at decimals all week. This has included the place value of decimals and the four operations. All of the children have done tremendously well and are now ready to move on to decimal, fraction and percentage work next week. In English, we have continued to read Wonder to the conclusion of Via's chapter. Our work this week focused on analysing Via as a character and we then made our own beginning of the next chapter based on what we know so far.

As it was Internet Safety Day, we have also done some work around this. We completed a quiz on how to deal with certain online situations and the children also completed a related experience through Now Press Play!

Finally, we also thoroughly enjoyed watching our Special Friends in Reception putting on their Class Assemblies - we even managed to get involved in them!
