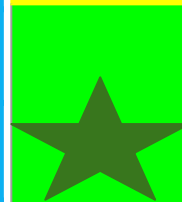

Reception

We have had an amazing week this week continuing our learning about minibeasts. In Literacy, we have been writing life cycle facts about frogs and butterflies. Now that our real caterpillars have arrived, we can watch the process happen before our eyes! In maths we have continued to learn more about the numbers 11-20. We have been thinking about missing numbers and ordering numerals to 20, too.

We had a lovely service crowning Our Lady on Wednesday. We laid our flowers and spoke about why Mary is so special to us. We also really enjoyed our celebration day on Friday and learning all about King Charles III.

Year 1

This week we have completed our narratives based on "Meerkat Mail". The children have worked hard to apply all their knowledge of sentence structure and punctuation. We are also working hard on our phonics in preparation for our screening check. In maths we completed our learning in measure with work on capacity and volume. We started our work on counting in 2's and 10's. We have been keeping our skills sharp with our daily fluency activities. In RE we have been discussing the difference between holidays and Holy days. On Thursday we took part in our whole school celebration when we crowned Mary. We are learning to sign the Hail Mary too. In geography we consolidated our knowledge of the United Kingdom by label key information on a map. We finished our week celebrating and commemorating the coronation of King Charles III. We spent time learning about King Charles' life and what type of King he may be and we buried time capsules in our Year 1 garden and completed activities based around the story of "The King's Pants" by Nicholas Allan.

Question: Can you count in 2's to 50?

Year 2

This week has been another great week in Year 2.

The children have been working extremely hard in all our subjects and we are proud of their resilience and work ethic.

In Maths this week, we have concluded our Multiplication and Division unit. We have now started to study fractions and have been looking carefully at parts and wholes. We have also started a unit about Mass and Capacity. Here the children have studied grams and read scales with intervals of 2, 5 and 10.

In English we have been continuing to study Mr Bunny's chocolate factory. The children have been identifying and writing exclamatory sentences. They have also adopted the role of Mr Bunny and written some emotive speeches to try and persuade the chickens to return to his chocolate factory.

On Thursday, the children took part in the crowning of Our Lady. They children presented their flowers to our statue during the service and showed great respect.

They created a prayerful atmosphere.

Finally, we completed our week by celebrating King Charles III's coronation. We took part in activities about his life and created our own artwork.

Question: How do we write and exclamatory sentence?



Year 3

This week in Year 3 we have started our new focus text in English which is called 'Escape from Pompeii.' We have read through the book and analysed what life must have been like living in this period of time and in that city.

In maths our new focus for learning is 'money'. We have looked this week at converting between pounds and pence, solving problems involving money and also linking money to real life scenarios.

In History this week we have focused on a 'Royal Week' where we have researched the life of King Charles III and created biographies.

In Geography we have compared the Amazon Rainforest to our home city of Manchester, focusing on themes such as climate, population and size.

Question- What happened to the city of Pompeii?

Year 4

Year 4 had a fantastic week! On Wednesday afternoon, Mrs Bilic's class enjoyed a trip to Droylsden library. The librarian talked to the class about how the library works and how the books are arranged. The children were given time to browse the shelves and those who had their own library cards chose a book to take home. On Thursday, both classes had a Forest School session. The children were put into groups and had to build their own dens. It was great to see the children working as part of a team to build the best den. Afterwards, there was a quiz on the kings and queens of England, followed by a game on the field.

The children are becoming confident at working with fractions. This week they have practised finding equivalent fractions. They also did a practice multiplication test which they all did well in. In English, we began to look at model texts which will help them to write their own non-chronological report next week.

On Friday we marked The Coronation of King Charles by looking at his life: his childhood years, his interest in environmental issues and the coronation event itself.

Question: How many fifths are there in 3 wholes?

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Year 5

It has been a short, yet busy, week in Year 5. The week culminated in a wonderful celebration of the Coronation of King Charles III. This included writing a biography of King Charles III, designing and painting a Coronation portrait, asking and answering questions about the role of a Monarch and exploring the Coronation ceremony. The children had a fantastic day and enjoyed greatly our afternoon tea.

In Maths this week, we concluded our unit of work on decimals and percentages with ordering and comparing decimals up to 3 decimal places and rounding decimals to the nearest whole number, tenth and hundredth.

As part of our work on Tudors, we analysed the reasons for the Reformation and categorised them as political, religious or economical. Armed with this information, we produced a persuasive argument in role as King Henry VIII, outlining the reasons for a break from Rome. Next week, we will produce a double-page spread showing the effects of the Reformation and Dissolution of the Monasteries on Tudor society, as well as society today.

Can you give three reasons why Henry VIII wanted to break from Rome?

Year 6

It has been an incredibly busy week in Year 6 this week as we have been preparing for the SATS exams next week. The children have put a great amount of effort into their learning and we can't wait for them to have the opportunity to showcase their English and Maths knowledge.

This week in Maths we have been looking at statistics with a focus on pie charts. The children have had to apply their knowledge of fractions and percentages to help them read, interpret and draw pie charts. In the afternoons we have enjoyed playing kahoot quizzes and marking completed SATS papers as revision.

In English, we have been playing a variety of games to help us revise and grammatical terms.

The children have particularly enjoyed being active in their English lessons. Our guided reading texts this week both had a science focus. Our first text was a short biography of Charles Darwin which linked perfectly with our Science unit: Evolution and Inheritance. The second text was about the human digestive system and we learnt how our body digests food and absorbs nutrients.

This week saw an end to our morning booster sessions. Please may we take this opportunity to say a huge well done to the children who committed to attending sessions to progress their learning.

Over the bank holiday weekend, we ask that your child gets plenty of rest and enjoys the celebrations taking place. If your child would like to complete any revision, we suggest that they do a small amount on Freckle however, we would love for the children to relax and enjoy time with families and friends.

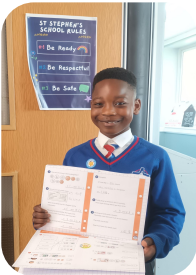
