Nursery

We have had a wonderful time learning about colours this week. The children have painted, built towers, repeated sentences, sorted using the colours red, blue and yellow. Alongside, we have been reading Pete the Cat and his white shoes. Our nursery rhyme of the week has been I can sing a rainbow. The children have taken part in their second PE lesson and they really enjoyed themselves. In RE we have spoken about who is in our family. We had a walk to the allotment and forest on Thursday. We listened for different sounds. The children heard the ducks and chickens so while we were there we fed them.

Question: What piles did Pete the Cat step in?

Reception

We have had another fantastic week in Reception! We continued reading our class book "What Makes Me a Me?" but we moved on to our physical features. We read the story "FunnyBones" to help us understand what our skeleton is made up of. Next week we will think about our facial features. In maths we have been looking at "Goldilocks and the Three Bears" and what special number is used throughout the story.

We are doing so well with our Talk 4 Writing - we have started to create our very own stories!!

We were very lucky to meet our Year 6 Special Friends this week. We are excited for the year ahead with them. Thank you, Year 6!

Question: How many bears, bowls, chairs and beds did Goldilocks find? How many ways can you make this amount?



Year 1

We have enjoyed another great week in year one. In English this week, we continued our work on Bumblebear. We thought about Norman's daily planner and the children wrote sentences about the things Norman does at Bee School. In Maths, we have been counting on from any number within 10 and have started looking at one more than. Children have been working hard to recognise numbers as words. In Science this week, we discussed the five senses, focussing on sight. Children worked scientifically to test how many bean bags they could throw into a box with both eyes open compared to with one eye open and then both eyes closed. In History, we looked at our current monarchy and discussed what would make a good or bad Monarch. We then learnt about King Charles III. In R.E, we identified the holy family and discussed how families can be different. Children have also been working more independently to complete their five rainbow challenges. To finish the week, we had a lovely Eucharist service in church, followed by an exciting session of forest school.

Question: What activities does Norman do at Bee School?

Year 2

We have enjoyed our week in year 2 and the children have been working extremely hard. In English, we have been continuing to study 'I want my hat back'. The children have been considering the thoughts and feelings of the bear, ensuring that they write in full sentences and use appropriate punctuation.

In Maths, we have been exploring place value, considering partitioning and how to partition in different ways.

In Religion, we have been reading the creation story from the book of Genesis. The children have looked closely at the scripture and completed work around the order in which God created our world.

Furthermore, we have also started our unit of work in History based on the Great Fire of London. The children have had the opportunity to showcase their existing knowledge of the subject.

Finally, during our Art lessons, the children studied the use of natural and everyday materials to create artwork.

We also enjoyed welcoming our parents into school on Wednesday and hope that the information provided and sent out was helpful.

Question: How can I partition 35 in different ways?

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Year 3

This week has shown Year 3 getting down to work on lots of exciting activities. In English we have worked on our first piece of writing which was about the changing seasons. The children had to write a fact file using Time Adverbials and descriptive language to engage the reader. We also talked about the meaning of 'perseverance' and times when they had to possess this quality to master a particular skill.

In Maths, we have continued to explore numbers up to 1,000,, representing them in different ways and using flexible partitioning to explain them.

In RE we have enjoyed thinking about what makes a home. The children talked about how a loving family was at the heart of a home. They also agreed that home can sometimes be challenging as we have to share and forgive others. Both classes are now busy trying to read at home at least five times a week so they can get stamps in their reading diaries and then move around the reading chart.

Question: How many ways can you partition the number 222?

Year 4

This week in Year 4, we have continued our class book of The Legend of Rock, Paper and Scissors. We have analysed sentences and corrected incorrect grammar. We have written warrior cries as well as short descriptive recounts and used conjunctions linked to time.

In maths we have looked at partitioning numbers up to 10,000 as well as focusing on showing 1, 10 and 100 more or less than a given number.

In Science we have looked at grouping animals into the vertebrates or invertebrates categories and analysed animal X-Rays to help us see more clearly.

In RE we have looked at the stories of Abraham and Jacob and focused closely on the elements of family within those stories.

In History we have begun our unit on Ancient Egypt. We have researched the 'whole-history' timeline to see where Ancient Egypt fits as well as looking at the history of Ancient Egypt from start to end dates.

Question- What is an invertebrate? Can you give an example of one?



Year 5

Another fantastic week here in Year 5! Continuing our unit on 'Saving the Butterfly' by Helen Cooper, the children enjoyed listening to the story before identifying any underpinning meanings, themes and symbolism used within the story. From this, the children produced reflections based upon what they had understood, using synonyms and modal verbs to enhance their writing. In preparation for their extended writing, the children have analysed a variety of diary entries, both collaboratively and individually, to identify features and discuss the effects.

Building upon our new understanding of 'Friction' in Science, the children have begun to understand air resistance and its effects on moving objects. Using scientific vocabulary, the children have been able to describe - in detail - the relationship between the surface area of a shape or object and the speed in which this travels through the air. The children's developing understanding and enthusiasm is great to see and we are very proud of their achievements.

In Maths, the children have been continuing and building upon their knowledge of place value to read and write numbers to 1,000,000. We have explored powers of 10, involving the multiplication and division of integers by 10, 100, 1000 and 10,000 using pictorial place value charts to visually represent the numbers. Extending this further, we have applied this knowledge to problem solve and identify patterns in sequencing numbers.

Question: What does it mean to be streamlined and what effect does it have on the amount of air resistance?

Year 6

We've had a fantastic week of learning in Year 6! This week in Maths we have been recapping rounding and negative numbers. This has involved looking at different representations, including lots of numberline work.

In English, we have been re writing Nate's poem about the Beast as a narrative. To add an element of challenge to this, the children had to write in the role of the Beast. The children stretched and challenged themselves to use a wide range of ambitious vocabulary.

Our RE lesson this week focused on Saint Paul and one of the letters he wrote to Titus. Saint Paul shared his journey to faith and through this we developed our understanding regarding God's love for all.

In Science, we have started to look at the different ways that animals and plants can be classified. This involved choosing our own criteria to sort animals appropriately. Yesterday, we spent the afternoon in Reception with our Special Friends which was a highlight of the week! We are really excited to be Guardian Angels to the Reception children this year!

Thank you to all parents/ guardians who attended Mrs Gibson's class assembly this week. Mr Fitch's class assembly will be on Wednesday 27th September at 9.05pm in the school hall. Parents and guardians are warmly invited.

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
