

Nursery

The Nativity is underway... This week the children have started to learn and listen to the songs we will be performing as part of our nativity. We can't wait for you to see it!

In literacy we have continued with Owl Babies. The children are becoming very familiar with the book and have created actions to go along with the story. In Maths we have been learning all about the number one and went on an outdoor hunt to find one of each object. We have also taken part in Spatial Sense Day where the children talked about where they live, found it on the map, where they have been on trips and learnt a new song about travelling around the world. Mrs Artingstall led our first forest school session of the half-term; we planted broad beans, went on a stick hunt for the hedgehog's house and picked the sunflowers. On Friday we took part in a special remembrance circle time where the children laid a poppy on the soldiers hill.

Reception

We have had a lovely week learning about "The Gunpowder Plot." We created a story map of the event using our Talk for Writing skills and we were able to retell the event in the correct sequence. In maths we have been thinking about the numbers 1, 2 and 3. We have been comparing, subitising, counting and recognising. In RE we have started our unit all about Baptism. We visited the church and had a lovely session with Father where we saw the font and learned all about the meaning of Baptism. Our special Geography day on Thursday was so much fun. We learnt all about maps and spoke about holidays we had been on in different countries. We took part in a special Remembrance service with our Year 6 special friends. We made poppies together and displayed them in our Remembrance garden.

We started "My Happy Mind" this week too where we learnt all about our brains. We are ready to start out magical themed topic next week. Have a lovely weekend everyone:)

Year 1

The children in year one have been working really hard this week and we appreciate all of their hard work. In English, we used 'Talk for Writing' to create a story map of 'Supertato'. The children then used imitation to sequence sentences. In maths, we have been working on number bonds within 10 and using them to solve addition word problems. In R.E, the children made belonging badges to show which groups they belong to. We then looked at some Baptism photos and discussed how we become part of the Church. In science, we began our unit on materials. The children identified what different objects are made from. To celebrate remembrance, children painted purple poppies for animals in the war. Children also spent some time planting in the Year 1 garden. We finished the week with a lovely Mass.

Year 2

Year 2 have had a fantastic yet busy week this week.

In History this week, we have been studying WW1 and we have thought about those about those who died during war in this month of November. We have looked closely at the life of Edith Cavell and written diary entries in role to show what a day in the life of nurse during WW1 would be like.

In English we have started a new text named, 'The Disgusting Sandwich'. The children have completed retrieval questions about the text and looked carefully at imperative verbs and commands.

Also, in order to launch our Geography unit, we completed a spatial sense day. Here the children completed some fieldwork where we looked closely at our school grounds; studied aerial maps of our school and created our own.

In Science, we have concluded our current unit and thought about healthy eating, personal hygiene and oral hygiene.

We concluded our week by celebrating mass and visiting the cenotaph to lay our decorated crosses that we have produce.

We were also extremely proud of the children for performing their assembly beautifully on Tuesday.

Year 3

Another exciting week in Year 3.

On Monday, we had a special assembly to introduce the children to our new programme of work called, 'My Happy Mind.' We then had a follow up lesson in class where we learnt about how the brain has different parts to it and we thought about a time when persevered to learn something new which had opened new neural pathways in our brain.

In English, we have continued with 'Stone Age Boy' collecting and classifying verbs. We wrote a short dramatic piece about the boy and girl in the story being confronted by a wild bear, describing how they felt and what they did. In Maths we have worked on adding one and ten onto two and three digit numbers using either a number line or place value counters.

On Thursday it was Spatial Awareness day in school. The children enjoyed distinguishing between human and physical geographical features and using 4 figure grid references on maps.

Year 3 prepared wreaths of poppies to present in mass on Friday. The children made a poppy each and wrote their family name on it.

Question: What does the word 'prefer' mean?

Year 4

On Monday, we began our week with a special assembly to introduce our new programme of work called, 'My Happy Mind.'

In English, we have continued with our book Change Sings. We have focused our grammar skill work on apostrophes whilst in our focused writing, we have planned and then written our own versions of the story.

In Maths we have worked on multiplication and division facts for the 3 and 6 time tables.

On Thursday it was Spatial Awareness day in school. We looked at using 6 figure grid references as well as map scaling.

For remembrance day, all children in year 4 created soldier silhouettes which they place in the ground at the front of school.

Question: Why is a 6 figure reference a better option than a 4 figure reference when reading maps?

Year 5

A fun-packed and diverse week in Year 5!

For Spatial Sense day on Thursday, we learned all about how geographers use relief maps, contour lines and layered shading to demonstrate differences in the height of the terrain. We matched contour lines to 3d models, analysed and drew conclusions about the terrain around Manchester using OS maps and created our own 3d model from 2d contour lines. The children loved learning about relief maps and produced some fantastic work.

This week, the children also learned about life in the trenches for soldiers in WW1. They wrote diaries from the viewpoint of the soldiers and will produce postcards in the style of WW1 embroidered silk postcards next week.

To commemorate Remembrance day, the children produced their own painting in the style of The Poppy Field by Claude Monet. These made up part of the school's tribute to those who have given their lives in conflict. We are very proud of the results.

Finally, on Monday, the children were introduced to My Happy Mind in assembly. In class, the children then explored the different parts of the brain - the Hippocampus, Amygdala and Pre-frontal Cortex. They learnt about the functions of each of these parts of the brain and how they work together in decision making. The children are looking forward to finding out more in our 'Meet the Brain' unit of work next week.

Question: What is a monologue and why are they important in understanding a character?

Year 6

Year 6 have had another exciting week in school. Mrs Williams led us in a fantastic assembly where we were introduced to 'My Happy Mind'. We loved learning about the parts of our brain and are excited to learn more about it next week.

We welcomed Charles and Samson (from CAFOD) into our classes this week and they talked to us about Catholic Social Teaching. The session made us reflect upon our place in society and the service we have towards others. We are looking forward to following this up with charity work.

In English, we started our new novel: Letters from the Lighthouse. We read the first three chapters and made some detailed inferences about the main characters. At the end of chapter three, we learnt that our main character, Olive, is going to be evacuated from her home in London.

In Maths, we have moved on to start our work on fractions. This has included simplifying and ordering, as well as identifying fractions on a number line. This has also tied into our Fluent in 12 focus which is currently centred around conversion between decimals, fractions and percentages.

Question: Can you name one of the Catholic Social Teaching keys?
