



### **Nursery**

This week in literacy we have finished Owl Babies. The children really enjoyed learning about owls and we can't wait to invite the owls into school. They have learnt lots of new big words including Nocturnal and thought. In Maths we have been learning all about the number two and went on an outdoor hunt to find two of each object. This week in Forest School we had hot chocolate by the 'fire' in class. We also took part in anti-bullying week, talking about our trusted friends, kind hands and feet. We are looking forward to start our new book 'WOW said the owl.'

Question - "What does Nocturnal mean?"

### Reception

We have had another great week this week! In Literacy, we started our new story "Room on the Broom" that links with our "Where is the magic?" topic. We retold the story in our own words using character puppets, we have sequenced the story and we have thought about how the characters feel in the story using emojis! Next week we will retell using a story map and actions. In maths, we have continued to think about the numbers 1, 2 and 3. We have enjoyed making magic wands, making repeating patterns and making witch and wizard dens.

We are loving spending time in our new outdoor areas. We are learning so much about the natural world around us.

In RE we have made Baptism cards and shared our own Baptism experiences.

Question: How did the frog feel when he found the wand in the pond?

#### Year 1

Year 1 have had great fun with their "Supertato" work this week. They have innovated the story and allowed Evil Pea to create more chaos in the supermarket. They worked hard writing their version of events. In maths we continue to focus on addition and subtraction. We have been learning about fact families.

In RE we looked at the symbolism of the baptismal candle and how it represents the light of Christ in our lives.

We had a great Happy Mind session and the children remembered lots about their brains. In our Ten Ten session we thought about what the Kingdom of God means. As part of Anti-Bullying week we have also been thinking about who can help us when we need support when we need to speak up.

In Science we have been learning about the properties of rock. We discuss why some materials are better suited to make objects because of their properties.

Task: Ask your child to tell you their Supertato story, using first, next and after that sentence starters.

#### Year 2

Year 2 have had a very exciting week! In English, the children have still been enjoying The Disgusting Sandwich. On Monday, the children made their own disgusting sandwiches and they wrote instructions about how to make one. The children have been looking at the characters' emotions in more detail and they used hashtags to summarise events, which they had lots of fun with! They have started to learn about subordinating conjunctions before they apply them into their writing next week.

In Maths, the children have been looking at related facts and number bonds to 100.

They have completed their Science unit about humans and they have shared ways about how we can keep ourselves healthy.

Question: If we know 8+1 = 9, then 80 + 10 =

#### Year 3

Another very busy week in Year 3.

In English we finished reading 'Stone Age Boy' and wrote a diary entry from the boy's perspective. The children did a great job of using descriptive verbs and expanded noun phrases to paint a picture of life in Stone Age times.

In Maths we have gone onto subtracting one digit numbers from two and three digit numbers using base ten or a numberline.

The children enjoyed learning about animal skeletons in Science, comparing them to human skeletons.

In RE we have started a new unit called 'Promises.' We discussed the importance of keeping promises and how breaking a promise can harm a relationship.

Mrs Herbert's class did an amazing assembly on Wednesday, showcasing their writing and art work. We also enjoyed their thoughtful prayers for peace.

**Question: 124 - 7 =** 

#### Year 4

In Year 4 this week we have been very busy.

In English, we have started our new topic, 'Little People, Big Dreams: Amanda Gorman', by reading the text and looking at the different features of a biography and how powerful poetry can be. We ordered the events of Amanda Gorman's life into a timeline and we also learnt a brand new word: inauguration!

In RE, we have continued with our new topic of Confirmation, discussing how this is a very special sacrament after First Holy Communion, and why we choose a Saint's name when being confirmed.

In Science, we have been learning about changing states and the definitions of key vocabulary such as 'boiling', 'condensation', 'freezing', 'melting', and 'solidifying'.

We have started our new Geography topic all about rivers and their different features, learning all about river journeys.

We have also continued with My Happy Mind, re-introducing ourselves to the key parts of our brain and discussing when the hippocampus, amygdala and prefrontal cortex help us in our daily lives.

#### Year 5

Another busy week here in Year 5! This week, in English, we began by analysing the character of Mrs Evans in Room 13. We have been revisiting and refining our use of simple, compound and complex sentences; utilising the 'I SAW A WABUB' acronym to carefully select subordinating conjunctions to enhance and extend our writing. As we progress through the chapters of the story, the children are eager to understand and learn more about the plot and have enjoyed unpicking the features of writing which add suspense. Particularly, we have analysed the authors' use of speech and highlighted the impact this has on the reader. Keep it up!

Maths this week introduced the children to our new unit on 'Multiplication and Division' whereby we have developed our understanding of multiples and factors. The children have worked systematically to find the common factors and have organised these into venn diagrams. Next week we will begin to look at prime, square and cube numbers.

On Thursday, we took part in a CAFOD workshop to introduce the children to the Catholic Social Teaching principles. We worked in teams to analyse scenarios and decipher which of the principles they related to. We had some really interesting discussions and the children offered fantastic reasoning and explanations for their answers. We were very proud of the children's contributions and look forward to welcoming the CAFOD team back again soon.

Question: What are the rules for punctuating direct speech?

#### Year 6

This week in English, we have learnt about the purpose of semicolons and practised applying this understanding by creating, and writing, a missing poster for Sukie. We then read about Olive's evacuation journey and mapped out her emotions using emojis.

In Maths, we have been continuing to look at fractions. This has included solving problems where the denominators need to be changed first, as well as looking at how we can order fractions based on their numerators or denominators.

Our science lesson this week focused upon microorganisms. We learnt about what microorganisms are and how they can impact our daily lives as humans. We learn that microorganisms can be both useful and harmful.

In our 'My Happy Mind' session this week, we practised happy breathing and thought about how we could implement this in our lives outside of school.

Question: Name a type of fungi.
