

What an amazing first week back!

Well Done Nursery, you have settled back in to school life well. Our new starters have blown our socks off, we are so excited to have you all at St Stephens.

This week the children have read traditional tales, drawn lots of pictures, explored small worlds, made sandcastles, built towers and become mummies and daddies in the house.

The children have taken part in Squiggle whilst you wiggle, cosmic yoga, PE, Forest School sessions and invented their own stories.

Next week we are looking forward to starting our new book - The Naughty Bus and returning to number in maths.

Reception

We have had such a lovely first week back. The children were all ready for action after the break and have produced some lovely work!

We have started our new text "The Train Ride" in literacy which links to our new topic about journeys. We have summarised the story, sequenced the story and thought about how the characters feel in different parts of the story.

In maths we have been learning some new vocabulary: equal and unequal as well as what "zero" means and how it is represented.

In RE we will be reflecting on the story of when "Mary and Joseph took Jesus to the Temple" and thinking about celebrations in church.

Year 1

Year 1 have hit the ground running in the New Year and have settled so quickly back into their learning routines., Well done children! Our new English text is called Unplugged by Steve Antony. The children have shown good understanding of the story and are doing so well retelling the story using their story maps. In maths we are looking at place value to twenty. We are beginning to understand tens and ones, count forwards and backwards and write number names in words. Our RE lessons began with the story of the Epiphany and the children thought about gifts they would have liked to have given Jesus.

We had a mini science lesson on plants and planted a seed. We will observe how it grows over the next four weeks as we learn about animals. New phonics groups have started and we would encourage you to support your child in learning their new sounds and practising their reading. We finished our week with a lovely Mass.

Question : Can you name parts of a plant?

Year 2

We have had a lovely first week back after Christmas! It has been fantastic seeing the children's enthusiasm towards their learning and they have settled back into following our behaviour curriculum extremely well.

On Monday, we learnt about the feast of Epiphany in R.E. The children learnt the significance of the gifts that the wise men gave to Jesus and they thought about what gifts they would give to Jesus.

In Maths, the children have continued their addition and subtraction topic. We have been adding and subtracting 10s and we have introduced the exchanging method when crossing the 10s boundary.

We started our Materials unit in Science where we have explored different types of materials and looked at their properties.

In Geography, the children have identified the seven continents and located them using compass points.

We ended the week by starting our Story Seekers project. We discussed the children's favourite stories and generated one of our own using key images from fairytales.

Question: What are the 4 main compass points?





Year 3

Our first week back has been extremely busy.

On Monday we started a new Maths unit on Multiplication and Division. This week we have looked at arrays, groups and multiples.

In English we planned and wrote our last piece of writing on 'The Dark.' The children were given a blurb and were asked to write a parallel story from The Dark's point of view. They came up with some original ideas.

Last weekend was the celebration of the Epiphany so we read and talked about the visit of The Magi. The children had to write a WANTED poster with King Herod offering a reward to whoever found the Holy Family.

In Science, we have begun our topic on Movement. Having studied the skeleton last term, we are now seeing the important role of joints in giving humans and animals motion.

In our 'My Happy Mind' session, the children enjoyed learning about how we can keep our brains healthy.

In Guided Reading, we read a text about Chinese New Year and compared Chinese traditions with those we have in the UK.

Question: Give three multiples of 2 which are between 30 and 50.

Year 4

We are back to business as usual in Year 4 this week!

In English, we have finished off A Christmas Carol by writing an apology letter from Scrooge to Bob Cratchit and telling him all about the ghosts' visits.

In Maths we are continuing with Multiplication and Division and really diving into all of our times tables and looking at inverse operations and repeated addition. We have also focused specifically on the 11 times tables this week and the children have achieved some very good results.

In RE, we looked at The Epiphany and the gifts that the Three Wise Men brought to Bethlehem to see baby Jesus. The children had to write from the point of view of one of the wise men and talk about their chosen gift. We are now getting ready to start our new topic of Community.

In Science, we are continuing on with our unit of States of Matter, this week we looked at condensation and the water cycle.

Finally, in My Happy Mind we discussed our different character strengths and how we all have these but in different amounts!

Year 5

What a fantastic week here in Year 5 and a great start to 2024. It has been lovely to welcome all of the children back after the half term!

In English, we have begun our new unit which focuses on the novel 'Brightstorm' by Vashti Hardy. We have thoroughly enjoyed unpicking this exciting, fast-paced adventure story and analysing both the characters' emotions and interesting vocabulary. With focus on the rich description of the airships in the story, the children have been able to identify words such as 'bimontgolfiers', 'quadrablade' and 'uniscope'. Using these, we have unpicked the words to understand their etymology. This new understanding allowed the children to analyse images of other airships and write descriptions of their own, adopting the author's use of vocabulary by adding different prefixes relating to quantity to an existing root word. These made for very interesting reads and the children should be very proud.

In Maths, we are continuing our Fractions unit. The children demonstrated an excellent understanding and have been able to reason, identify, compare and order fractions less than 1. Next week, we will extend this learning to fractions beyond 1 before using this knowledge to add and subtract fractions.

MyHappyMind has brought us to our second unit; 'Celebrate'. The children thoroughly enjoy the weekly sessions and we have begun to understand our own characters. We were introduced to the fact that our character is half determined by genetics and the other half of our character varies due to personal experiences and how we develop. The children engaged in interesting discussions and reflected on their own character in their journals.

Question: What does the word 'uniscope' mean? How do you know?

Year 6

It has been wonderful welcoming all the Year 6 children back to school this week!

We have loved our English lessons this week! We have analysed the cover of our new text, 'The House with Chicken Legs', and made predictions about the text. We learnt that one of the characters in the text is Baba Yaya- a Salvic folklore character. We analysed images of Baba Yaga and matched them to descriptive features from text.

In Maths, the children have been exploring geometry. Mr Fitch began the year with a bang by introducing the children to coordinates through a game of battleship!

In RE, we have studied the book Refuge. This book tells the story of the Holy Family's journey to Egypt after the wise men warned Mary of their fate if they returned home.

Question: Can you define the words benevolent and malevolent? Why are both of these words used to describe Baba Yaga?
