#### EYFS/ Key Stage One

I am thrilled to confirm that our Annual Easter Bonnet Parade for Children in **Nursery**, **Reception**, **Year 1 and Year 2** is back this year! We invite all children to create an Easter Bonnet at home and bring it in for a Parade on **Friday 11th April**. It is a wonderful event and has been supported so well in past years. Parents are invited to attend.



Plan 1 will be for parents from Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 to gather on the playground after drop off. Children will then parade their bonnets on the playground for all to see - if the weather is bad, we will go to plan 2. We will inform you the day before when we know more about the weather!

Plan 2 will be in the school hall at the following times to watch your child walk down the catwalk. Please only attend during your allocated time, we will clear the hall before the next set of parents are allowed to enter so please wait outside until a member of staff signals for your time to come in:

We will allow you to take individual photographs of your child but you will not be allowed to photograph or film the parade for Safeguarding reasons.

#### **Key Stage 2 (Years 3 to 6)**

For children in Key Stage 2, **Years 3 to 6**, we invite children to decorate an egg - we have had some incredible creations over the years and I cannot wait to see what comes in this year. We display the eggs in the school hall on the day (Friday 11th April) for all classes to come and look at the creations.

\*\*Please can we ask for donations of Easter Eggs to help us with the prizes for the Bonnet and decorated eggs - these can be sent in with your child or left at the office.



# SHARING SUNDAY'S GOSPEL WITH PARENTS & FAMILIES

#### Dear Parents and Carers,

Today is Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent. This is the day when Catholics throughout the world come together to celebrate Mass and receive ashes on their foreheads to mark the beginning of the Lenten Season.

The season of Lent reminds us of Jesus' 40 days of fasting and prayer in the wilderness, where he grew stronger through resisting various temptations. In this Sunday's Gospel, the tempter makes three suggestions in an effort to divert Jesus from his true mission.

#### Wednesday 5th March 2025

Jesus rejects the temptations, one after another - each time with a word from Scripture, which is the Word of God.

It is part of the human condition to face temptations in life. But the more familiar we become with the Word of God, the more we too can be strengthened to resist temptations and be filled with new life. Enjoy your week and help spread God's love, through LENT.

#### THE GOSPEL IN CHURCH Sunday 9th March 2025



Following his baptism, Jesus went out into the desert for forty days. He was all alone and he ate nothing because he was fasting. Knowing that Jesus would be hungry, the Tempter told him to turn a stone into bread.

But Jesus refused and said, "Scripture says, 'No one lives on bread alone.'" Then the Tempter showed him all the kingdoms of the world, promising Jesus all their power and glory if Jesus would worship him rather than God. But Jesus said, "It is written, 'You must worship the Lord your God, and serve Him only!" Finally, the Tempter took Jesus to the top of the temple and told him to prove he was the Son of God by jumping off, and have God's angels come to save him. But Jesus said, "You must not put the Lord your God to the test." After Jesus had resisted three times, the Tempter left him.



SHARE & CARE! Growing in Goodness & Love: This Wednesday's Word...

"Lent is a time for drawing near to Christ by listening to the word of God and celebrating the sacraments." Pope Francis





We welcomed Father C into our Nursery class on Ash Wednesday, it was lovely to see him and we enjoyed his teachings. As a class we said a special prayer and began to understand the importance of Ash Wednesday.

We made the sign of the cross and this was very special.

Mrs Artingstall welcomed us to the school allotment this week, we went on a hunt to find 'Jasper's Beanstalk) around the allotment- we had lots of fun!

The weather again was kind to us and we got to plant some peas in the soil.

On Thursday we loved taking part in World Book Day, we enjoyed activities based on Elmer (the elephant), Fairy Tales, Princesses and Superheroes!

We loved listening to our favourite stories and talking about our favourite book characters.

#### Reception

Another fabulous and busy week in Reception! It was so lovely celebrating all of our lovely children at parents evening. Thank you to all who came.

We had the best day for World Book Day! The children looked fantastic and really enjoyed the book swap. We hope you enjoy sharing your new books and stories at home.

In Literacy we read our whole school book called "Leaf." We thought about the different animals in the book and we created art and garlands with leaves we found in our outdoor area. In maths we completed our unit about 6, 7 and 8. We are looking forward to learning more about height and length next week.

#### Year 1

This week in we have been learning to re tell our dinosaur story using our story maps and then using this write detailed sentences. In maths we completed our assessments on addition and subtraction within 20. We have also started our new topic of place value to 50. We started by counting forwards and backwards and then in jumps of 10. In geography we learned about different types of weather and have started recording the weather daily. We reflected on the meaning of Lent and made our Lenten promises. The children were respectful and sang beautifully at our Ash Wednesday Mass. We ended our week celebrating World Book Day- we did lots of fun activities and especially enjoyed our school book Leaf by Sandra Dieckmann. Thank you for all your effort with costumes the children looked fantastic!

Task: Practise counting forwards and backwards to 50. Can you spot any of these numbers in the locality?

#### Year 2

In Maths this week the children have worked hard to count with 2s and use this knowledge to work out multiplication and division problems. In English they wrote their own letter of resignation as part of our 'Mr Bunny's Chocolate Factory' unit. In Science, we explored some different types of habitats and thought about why there are suitable for different animals. In RE, we have reflected on what we strive to achieve within ourselves during Lent and wrote our own Lenten promises. During Ash Wednesday Mass the children were very respectful. The children had a fantastic time on World Book Day and enjoyed some book themed activities - they looked fantastic in their outfits.

Question: Why can polar bears live in a polar habitat?

#### Year 3

It has been a lovely week in Year 3! In Maths we have learned about converting m to cm and cm to mm. At the moment we are measuring length and height using m, cm and mm.

In English children have been encouraged to use their best presentation skills in writing their diary entry about chapter 3 of George's Marvellous medicine.

In RE we have learned about Lent and children have discussed the importance of Lent and what they would give up during this time. Following this we attended Mass at Church, where we all received blessings and ash on our foreheads from Father C.

In Guided Reading we read a range of texts and answered comprehension questions.

In Science we have started a new topic called Soil. Children are learning about different soils and why they are important for the environment and natural habitats.

#### Year 4

#### Another busy week in Year Four!

With Ash Wednesday marking the start of Lent, we all went to church for a beautiful mass and to receive our ashes. Father C spoke about how Lent is a time for everyone to become a better version of themselves and how it is a fresh start. The children considered his words carefully and wrote some lovely Lenten Promises reflecting on the positive changes they can make.

On Thursday, we celebrated World Book Day. The children's outfits were amazing! As a school, we read the book Leaf about a polar bear who had become lost. Then, we did some reading activities around the story.

In English, we spent the week writing a narrative based on our novel, Edward Tulane. We read a chapter which left us on a cliffhanger and so we wrote the next chapter. The children had amazing ideas and really enjoyed writing their story.

#### Year 5

What an incredible week it has been for our Year 5 pupils!

As we embrace the season of Lent, the children have been reflecting deeply and making their Lenten promises in RE. They also explored the upcoming Jubilee for 2025, which Pope Francis has themed 'Pilgrims of Hope'. Inspired by this, the children penned their own heartfelt pledges, aiming to spread hope to others in our community and across the world.

In Maths, the children have been tackling long multiplication, developing their skills with formal methods and expanding to 4-digit by 2-digit calculations. Once fluent with this method, the children applied their knowledge to a range of contexts to deepen their understanding.

English lessons have been equally engaging as the children stepped into the shoes of Arty Brightstorm, creating vivid character descriptions that bring his personality and appearance to life! In celebration of World Book Day, we dove into 'Leaf' by Sandra Diekmann—a poignant picture book that addresses themes of acceptance, difference, and the pressing issue of global warming. The children analysed the text and its relationship to the illustrations, before creating their own alternative cover for the book.

Question: What does commutative mean in relation to calculations?

#### Year 6

Another busy week here in Year 6! A big thank you to all of the parents and carers who attended 6DF's class assembly this week. The children have continued to work extremely hard and we are very proud of them.

In Maths, we have begun our new unit on fractions, decimals and percentages. We first began by utilising our prior knowledge to understand and identify fraction and decimal equivalents. We then moved to look at fractions as division to support our learning. The children were able to apply their understanding of short division to calculate the equivalent decimals. As well as this, we revisited percentages ahead of next week where we will begin to unpick the relationship between fractions and percentages.

In English, the children have utilised their understanding of the text to successfully plan a narrative from the house's perspective which we will be writing next week before we move on to our new unit which focuses on 'Romeo and Juliet'.

In class, we have been learning about the Jubilee 2025 and Pilgrims of Hope. Pope Francis has invited Catholics to renew our hope and discover a vision that can "restore access to the fruits of the earth to everyone". Using this, we have considered the importance and created individual pledges for how we can make changes to be a good role model and a 'Pilgrim of Hope' this year.
