A MESSAGE FROM MR LAVIN...

This week, our school had the great privilege of welcoming the Diocese of Salford Anchor, which arrived on Wednesday as part of the diocesan-wide celebrations for the Year of Hope. The Anchor is a powerful symbol of faith, strength, and hope, reminding us that even in uncertain times, we are held steady by God's love. As part of its journey around schools in the Diocese, the Anchor spent time with us, helping to inspire reflection and prayer within our community.

Over the course of two days, the Anchor travelled from classroom to classroom, with each class taking time to host their own Celebration of the Word. These quiet, prayerful moments allowed our children to think about what hope means to them and how they can share hope with others through kindness, courage, and compassion. As part of this spiritual journey, every child made a personal pledge of hope—a promise to be a light for others in some small but meaningful way. To mark this special moment, each child was gifted a mini anchor to take home, encouraging them to continue these conversations of faith and hope during prayer time with their families.

Today, we took the Anchor to St Anne's in Audenshaw, where it continues its journey to other schools across the Diocese. We feel truly blessed to have played a part in this shared experience of unity and hope.






READ & REFLECT! Listen & Learn with Jesus, the Word!



Nursery

We have enjoyed recapping our phonics learning this week by revising the Nursery rhyme 'Pat a Cake, Pat a Cake,' we really loved copying the actions to this rhyme.

We have been learning the 'Y' sound and know that 'Yap', 'Yo-Yo' and 'Yellow' begin with this sound.

In Maths we have been learning all about 2D Shapes- we especially enjoyed learning about Triangles and learning facts about triangles.

In RE this week we continued learning about 'God's Wonderful World'.

We made our class pledge to look after our Nursery environment.

We discussed how we could do this and why it is important to look after our environment. On Thursday the children enjoyed taking part in a Special celebration when the 'Pilgrim's of Hope' Anchor visited our class.

This was very exciting to see because we had been learning about all the different symbols of Hope throughout the week and know that an Anchor is a symbol of hope.

Reception

The weeks in Reception are simply flying by! We began our week with a beautiful Stay and Pray session. A huge thank you to all who joined us — it was so special to come together in prayer. The children are becoming wonderful friends of Jesus and are beginning to understand more deeply the world God created and the lessons Jesus teaches us. In Literacy, we wrapped up our work on "Somebody Swallowed Stanley." The children absolutely loved the story and had such fun imagining new main characters for their own versions. Please ask your child who or what they chose — their ideas were so creative! In Maths, we completed our unit on grouping and sharing. We also explored odd and even numbers and how they connect — the children have been spotting patterns everywhere! In RE, we continued learning about God's Wonderful World. We spoke about how we can protect and celebrate our world.

Next week, we're excited for Forest School and Sports Day — two days we're all very much looking forward to!

Year 1

This week in Year 1 has been full of exciting learning! In English, the children started a new book, *The Day the Crayons Quit*, and thoroughly enjoyed listening to the crayons' worries and exploring their different personalities. In Phonics, they focused on growing the code and improving their fluency in reading. In Maths, the class worked with the greater than and less than symbols to compare numbers up to 100. Geography lessons took them to the seaside, where they explored weather patterns and located seaside towns on the map. In PSHE, they learned how to keep safe and began to understand some basics of First Aid. In RE, they listened to the story of Zacchaeus and reflected on what it means to have a change of heart. Finally, in PE, the children have been enthusiastically practising for Sports Day, showing great teamwork and determination!

Year 2

What a busy yet exciting week we have had in Year 2! We began the week taking part in The Jubilee of Hope Art competition, and making pledges. We welcomed the Dioscean Anchor into our classrooms and the children led a beautiful Celebration of the Word. In Maths, we have completed our unit on fractions, and the children have been finding fractions equal to a whole. In English, we continue 'The Twits', and wrote some fantastic character descriptions using similes. In History, we thought about whether the Titanic tragedy could have been prevented, and came up with solutions for the problems. The children have been practicing their athletic skills in PE this week and are excited for Sports Day. We concluded the week with a fun and exciting trip to Smihills Farm, where the children learnt about a range of animals, their offspring and diets.

Year 3

We have had an extremely busy week in Year 3. The highlight was when we welcomed the anchor into our classrooms and enjoyed a Celebration of The Word. As it has been Pilgrims of Hope week, the children have thought and discussed in class about how they can play their part to improve the world including acting as stewards of the earth. They made a pledge to play their part. On Thursday, both classes had Forest School sessions where they made butterflies out of clay and enjoyed learning about herbs and trees whilst singing along to the beautiful songs and hymns they performed at The Lowry. In English, they have been writing an extra part of the book, narrating an incident where Stuart gets himself into a sticky situation at home. In Maths we have been working on Money, converting pounds to pence as well as adding and subtracting. In RE, we have looked carefully at The Gifts of the Holy Spirit and discussed their significance.

Questions: What are the seven gifts of The Holy Spirit?

Year 4

Well done to Year 4 for completing another week. The children have worked hard in class this week. In English, we have been continuing to use dialogue and punctuate speech correctly and also continue reading our class text and using our hashtag symbol to summary multiple key events and moments within the story. The children are really enjoying this book! In maths, we are still working on our topic of money, using a number line to estimate different amounts of money. In science, the children have learnt about the different types of teeth that animals and humans have and what they are used for. In history, we have been learning more about the Industrial Revolution and how it affected Manchester. In RE, we have revised our learning on CAFOD and how it supports people all over the world. We have also been looking at Pilgrims of Hope and how we can be part of this mission during this Jubilee year. The children were excited to have our anchor of hope in class this week and we marked the occasion with a Celebration of the Word session and renewed our pledges to be pilgrims of hope this year.

Year 5

What a truly special week it has been for our Year 5 students! This week, we had the pleasure of welcoming the anchor to our school for Pilgrims of Hope Prayer Week. Together, we explored the meaning of hope, sharing personal reflections and celebrating our diverse perspectives. Based on this exploration, the children wrote pledges explaining how they could make meaningful changes to make the world a better place.

The excitement continued as our Year 5 students showcased their incredible talents during auditions for St Stephen's Got Talent. We were blown away by the performances and can't wait for the grand final on Friday, 18th July—it promises to be a vibrant celebration of our talented children!

In English, our focus has been on refining our skills with simple, compound, and complex sentences while diving into the heart of Wonder—describing the main events and crafting internal monologues for Auggie, inspired by 'The Little Freak' by Edwin Schaap. This has been an enriching way to deepen our understanding of character and narrative.

Meanwhile, in Maths, we've been hard at work calculating angles on a straight line and around a point, classifying polygons, and identifying the properties of 3D shapes. Next week, we will commence our unit of work on converting units of measurement.

Finally, in Geography, we produced a double-page spread explaining the consequences of deforestation on our rainforests and ways in which we can make sustainable choices to minimise the effects of deforestation on our planet.

Year 6

This week has been extremely busy in Year 6. The children have worked extremely hard and we are very proud of them.

In our R.E. work we have completed out unit of Pentecost, carefully considering our key question: 'What do I want to witness in my life?'. Understanding what it meant to be a witness of Christ was crucial before learning of key modern witnesses including: Darwin Ramos, Sister Rani Maria Vatalil and Matteo Farina. This generated some fantastic discussions and opportunities of reflection on how we, ourselves, can be witnesses of Christ. Following this, we focused on the work of Caritas and their efforts to support people experiencing hardship, children, the homeless and refugees - linking this carefully to our lives and this Jubilee year 'Pilgrims of Hope'. To begin our unit on 'Healing', we focused on Bartimaeus - a blind man healed by Jesus through faith - using our creativity to illustrate how he viewed the world before and after Jesus gave him sight.

In PSHE, we have continued our learning and understanding of ourselves and our bodies with particular focus on our emotions. We have learnt about how our hormones during puberty can have an impact on our emotions and how we can best support ourselves to regulate and understand these. The children have approached this unit with maturity and we are really proud of their engagement.

In the afternoons, we have been rehearsing for our school play 'The Greatest Showman'. This is coming together nicely. Please can the children continue to practice their lines and songs so we can put on the greatest show!
