Which words stood out for you in this Gospel, and why? What does the picture make you think about? Now explore this Wednesday's word, which is **USTENING**.




Wednesday's Word LISTENING

"Open up your heart and listen to what God is saying to you." Pope Francis

What did Mary do that was good? In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus knows that household jobs are important, but he reminds us how important it is to take time to listen to God. Jesus does not force us to listen to him, but he knows what's best for us. Listening is a sign of real love - it's a powerful way of showing that we care. Ask your child if they know someone who is a really good listener. Who does your child like to listen to? Do they know people who speak with kindness and love, and want good things for them and others? It may help your child if you give them an example of your own.

"Before we speak, it is necessary for us to listen. God speaks in the silence of the heart." St Teresa of Calcutta (Mother Teresa)

This Gospel reminds us that rushing frantically around can stop us hearing the wisdom of Jesus. We need first to listen to Jesus, to be reminded of what's really important in life; then it's time to swing into action. As the summer holidays approach, explore ways that can help you to listen to Jesus in these coming weeks. Perhaps you can: remember to have quiet times in prayer when you wake up, at bedtime or some other time - just for listening to God as he speaks to your heart; go to Church together; regularly read the gospels in this Wednesday Word Summer Special together. What other ways can you think of?

Year 1

We've had a very busy final full week!

In English, the children wrote letters inspired by *The Day the Crayons Quit*. They were incredibly persuasive and showed fantastic creativity as they imagined what their own crayons might say. In Maths, we completed our unit on measure by learning to tell the time to the hour and half past. The children did brilliantly! We've now begun exploring our next topic: money — recognising coins and beginning to understand their values. In Geography, we shared our knowledge about the seaside — discussing what we already know and building on it together. In Science, we finished our work on seasonal changes, reflecting on how the world around us transforms throughout the year. In RE, we continued learning about world faiths. This week, we heard the story of the Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) and learned about key moments in his life.

Year 2

What a busy final week in Year 2! In RE this week, the children have been thinking about how we can treasure God's world. We thought about things in our lives that we treasure, and the steps we can take to look after God's planet. In Geography, we completed our unit all about Nigeria. We explored the natural climates and habitats of Nigeria, landmarks of the capital city Abuja, and created amazing posters all about Nigeria's culture. In Science, we learned about the life cycles of butterflies and frogs, we learnt some amazing facts! We have been very reflective in our Celebration of the Word sessions this week and the children are leading these very well. We concluded the week with a very exciting time at St Stephen's Got Talent! A big well done Sienna, Evie-Rose, Hazel and Jess!

Year 3

What an exciting week in Year 3! Today some of the children performed in our Year 1 outdoor theatre for a Year 1 audience. They recited a selection of Michael Rosen's poems before we all sang six songs from The Salford Songbook. Today was also the St Stephen's Has Got Talent show where the Year 3's gave fantastic performances. They should be very proud of themselves.

In English we planned and wrote a letter from Stuart Little to a tiny girl called Harriet Ames who Stuart meets on his travels. The children did a great job of describing Stuart and inviting Harriet to join him on a canoe ride. In RE, we recapped on the Seven Gifts of The Holy Spirit, focusing on the gift of Fortitude. We thought about how Mary showed fortitude throughout her life, exploring the challenges she faced being the mother of Jesus. In Science, we continued with our study of plants, looking at reproduction, pollination and seed dispersal.

Well done to all of the children for getting to the end of the year so successfully. We are really proud of the children and all their hard work and determination this year; they have really stepped up to the challenge of year four and should be feeling good about heading into year five and upper key stage two.

In class this week, we have been rounding off our English unit and consolidating our maths works on shape and angles. We have explored the effects of the Industrial Revolution on cities and how the invention of the steam engine helped shape this period of time. We have learnt more about the digestive system, specifically what causes tooth decay and how to look after our teeth. In RE, we have reflected on reconciliation and the importance of confession and reflecting on our daily choices.

Well done to everyone who took part and represented our year group in St. Stephen's Got Talent this week, you are all brilliant and should be so proud of yourselves.
