# Nursery

What a fabulous week in Nursery we have had. The children have settled in to Nursery so fabulously and have really enjoyed their week. We have focussed on getting to know the areas, working on tidying up and learning to all sit together on the carpet for story time and singing time!

The children had their first PE lesson this week too and Mr Grantham was really impressed with their physical skills. The children also had their first Forest school session with Mrs Artingstall. We fed the chickens, collected leaves and flowers for our mud chicken and met the School Scarecrow, Emmeline. We can't wait for more learning next week.

#### Reception

This week we have been very busy exploring our new classrooms. We have made lots of new friends. We have enjoyed reading the Owl Babies story and Pete the Cat. We are all very excited and very tired after all of our new learning.

#### Year 1

Year I were excited to find a letter from Mole. He wrote to tell us that he had made some labels and put them in the school garden. We enjoyed finding and reading the labels, then making some of our own.

We have been practising our counting skills and representing numbers in different ways. We thought about how we travel now, and how people might have travelled long ago. "

#### Year 2

Year 2 have had a great week and they have settled into their classes really well. We have been working really hard at following our school rules, 'be safe, be ready, be respectful' and we have been sharing examples of how we can follow our school core values. In English, we have started our new book, 'The Highway Rat' and we have written our own story about a cave. We have been consolidating our understanding of place value in Maths and we are able to recognise the tens and ones in 2 digit numbers. In R.E, we have shared what we know about The Creation Story and we have shared our knowledge about our new History topic, The Great Fire of London, too. All the teachers are so proud of the children and we have lots of exciting activities planned to look forward to next week!

#### Year 3

What a fantastic start to Year 3! All of the children have settled in well and myself, Mrs Shuttleworth and Miss Hill couldn't be more proud of them. In English, we have made predictions about Stone Age Boy and asked and answered questions about the text to check our understanding. In Maths we are looking at place value in 3 digit numbers. We began by mind-mapping the information we already know about a number and have been building on that all week. To support our understanding, we have been exploring a variety of visual images and considering how we can partition numbers in different ways. We have also been revising our 2, 5 and 10 times tables in our additional maths sessions. As part of our History topic, we considered our question - Flintstones: Fact or Fiction? We analysed the cartoon to identify what we thought was true and false about life in the Stone Age. We also composed questions about the Stone Age, which will help to guide our learning throughout the half term. In RE, we are beginning our topic on Homes, looking at what makes a house a home and is there a recipe for a happy family. We have had an extremely busy week and are excited for the learning journey we have begun.

### Year 4HB

This week, we have done some writing on the fictional planet of Pandora. We imagined that we were an astronaut visiting this strange planet and wrote a blog back to those on Earth. The children did some wonderful writing, describing the dangerous creatures and the breathtaking landscapes. In Science, we created our own criteria for sorting different groups of animals according to different characteristics. We've been getting excited about our Koman trip to Chester in a few weeks, the children can't wait for their first school trip in a long time. Everyone in 40s has made a good start to the year and after a hard week's work, we are all looking forward to the Summer Fair!

#### Year 4HB

4HB have had a great start to our new school year. We read the first part of Marcus Rashford's brand new book 'You Are a Champion' which has inspired us to try our very best and believe in ourselves. As part of our Science topic of 'Living Things' we explored the range of life in our school allotments. In English we watched a part of the film 'Avatar' and did a piece of writing, using our imaginations to describe strange and wonderful creatures and plant life that exist on the moon Pandora. The children wrote some really detailed descriptions. We are all looking forward to our planned trip to Chester at the end of the month where we will learn about Roman Britain through examining artefacts, exploring ruins and listening to experts.

#### **Y5DM**

It has been an enjoyable and busy start to the year in our class. We have begun our new English book which is called 'Lean and the Place between'. In History, we have begun our topic of 'The Maya' which we have already learnt some amazing facts about. In Science, we have researched planets for our topic of 'Earth and Space' using the mini chrome books (which we are so lucky to have).

We have settled in really well and got lots of fantastic work completed.

**Y5LS** 

5LS have had a great start to the academic year. They have taken to the new routines around their new classroom brilliantly. We have thoroughly enjoyed studying the book, 'Leon and the place between' in English and are anticipating what the mysterious box could lead to. Also, the children have been showcasing their knowledge of place value in Maths and have shown great enthusiasm.

Within our wider curriculum, we have worked hard to study timelines of Britain and the Maya, as well as researching different planets in Science for our Earth and Space topic.

Finally, the children have been keeping fit in PE by completing a fitness session earlier in the week and later demonstrated their basketball skills during their final PE session.

Here's to another fantastic week of learning next week.

### **YEDF**

It has been fantastic to have our class back together after the summer holidays. In Maths, we have jumped straight in with place value of numbers up to seven-digits. I have been really impressed with how the children have applied their learning from last year to the slightly larger values. In English, we have done a written piece based on Snow White, but with a twist. Rather than just retelling the story, the children adopted the perspective of the poison apple. This has resulted in some very imaginative and creative accounts. On Thursday, we also had our first Mass together as a class. The children were respectful throughout and on a personal note, it was great to finally be able to go into church and attend a service. Although we are all looking forward to the Summer Fair, the children were unable to persuade me to be on the "Soak The Teacher" stand.

#### YBHG

I am very impressed with how the children have settled into life in Year 6. They are proving themselves to be brilliant role models for the younger children in school. This week in class we have been exploring 7 digit numbers, particularly thinking about place value. In English, we retold the story of Snow White from the perspective of the apple which led to some fantastic discussions about the purpose of an apple and other various objects. Next week, we are looking forward to getting into our history topic 'Ancient Greece' and also thinking about our big question in RE, 'Do you have to learn love?'

A fantastic start to the year 6HG- I am one very proud teacher!
