


Sacramental Programme

Nursery

What a fabulous week in Nursery we have had. The children have been continuing to get to know the areas, working on tidying up and learning to all sit together on the carpet for story time and singing time! We have enjoyed learning our Nursery Rhyme of the week - Hickory dickory dock. We have learnt some new songs and learnt new mouth sounds in phonics. In maths we have been looking at colours and how to sort things of colour.


Our number song this week is 5 little ducks.

It was exciting in the woods this week, we found the Gruffalo! Yikes!




Year 1

In year I this week we have been

- painting pictures of our families.
- finding out about transport a long time ago, and putting pictures in order.
 - Writing about the mole and crocodile in our story.
 - Labelling parts of the body.
 - Counting and ordering numbers on numberlines
 - watching a pantomime.

We all have been given letter sounds or spellings to learn, and reading books. Try to read every day.

Year 2

What a busy week we have had in Year 2 this week! On Monday we had a great time watching the Wizard of Oz and on Tuesday we took part in drama workshop to help us learn about the Great Fire of London. Through time travel and games, we brought Pudding Lane to life and saved London by putting out the fire. It was great fun.

In science we have been identifying the materials that everyday objects are made of and discussing their properties.

We worked hard this week writing sentences about our story "The Highway Rat" by Julia Donaldson.

In maths we have been continuing to work on place value of 2 digit numbers - we are doing really well!

In RE we have been thinking about néw beginnings and the Creation story. Everyone should be proud of their hard work and brilliant behaviour - we have been ready, respectful and safe all week.

Question - What materials are everyday objects around your house made of?

What makes the material suitable?

Year 3

The week began with a bang with the pantomime 'The Wizard of Oz', which the children thoroughly enjoyed. In year 3, we have been using a range of sentence types to describe illustrations from Stone Age Boy, ensuring we punctuate them accurately. We also explored the spelling rules for the suffixes -ed, -ing, -er and -est, which have formed the basis for our spelling homework this week. In Maths, we used clues to the place value of digits to identify the mystery number and played dice games to try to make the largest 3 digit numbers. We composed a timeline of events throughout the Stone, Bronze and Iron Age in History and explored similarities and differences between the three eras. In Science, we compared the properties of a range of rocks, sketched them and wrote comparative sentences using accurate scientific vocabulary. In our 'Homes' topic, we analysed a range of idioms and compared them to our own and others' experiences of home e.g. 'There's no place like home.' 3LW had their first swimming lesson and are looking forward to the rest of the term, whilst 3CS/OH have been practising their basketball skills in PE.

Year 4

This week, Miss Scaife's class began their music lesson with Tameside Music Service. The children are really enjoying learning how to play a Djembe drum. Mrs Bilic's class have this to look forward to next half term. In Science, we created some classification keys and used them to help us classify unusual animals. We began our Roman topic, looking at some key events in the Roman Empire and we had our first art lesson on Roman mosaics. We are planning to create our own mosaic in the upcoming weeks. We are really looking forward to the trip to Chester next Friday to learn more about the Romans.



Newsletter -



This week in 50M we have completed our English work on our book of Leon and the Place Between. We wrote detailed setting descriptions of what the place was like. In Science, we have researched the work of Aristotle in proving the Earth is round and looked at some of the planets in greater focus. In History, we have worked more on The Maya and compared events to British history. We have begun our classroom Music sessions, with this half term being a focus on Classroom Jazz. The children played a range of instruments, performing alongside the backing track. We made our first visit to church this week and it was really nice to be back and we look forward to more visits in the future.

Y5LS

5LS have had another great week. We have finished discovering what happened to Leon in our text, Leon and the Place Between. In Maths, the children have explored place value further and completed a range of different activities to deepen our understanding.

Furthermore, we have been studying theories surrounding the shape of the Earth and researched the findings of Aristotle. Finally, the children took part in a brass instrument music lesson this week. They thoroughly enjoyed it and are looking forward to the session next week.

Year B

WOW! What a fantastic week we have had in Year 6. The children have certainly settled into life in Year 6 and are approaching all tasks with enthusiasm. This week in English, we began our text for the term: Romeo and Juliet. We firstly looked at the prologue and discussed what it told us about the story. We then read the text and created hashtags to retell the story #MontaguevsCapulet.

In RE, we have been thinking about what love is and who shows us love. We thought about people who showed loved during the pandemic. Inspired by the Gratitude art sculptures, we designed our own sculptures to thank those who have thought about others during the pandemic.

In maths, we have started to look at rounding numbers. We are going to continue this next week.
