


Attendance Challenge!

St Stephen's Attendance League





Year 2

Another busy week comes to a close in Year 2! We have been working hard in all our lessons.

In English we have been working on improving our sentence work when retelling the story of the Highway Rat. In maths we have been comparing numbers using < and > symbols.

We continue to look at suitability of materials and how certain materials can be changed. In RE we having thinking about Collective worship and how we would prepare our prayer table. We are also preparing for our first Year group mass by learning some hymns.

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Sear 3

NEWSLETTER

This week we have continued to develop our place value skills in Maths, comparing, ordering and sequencing 3 digit numbers. We applied our understanding of ordering numbers to real life contexts, using tape measures to measure different parts of our body and ordering the measurements. In English, we have written diary entries as stone Age Boy, applying our understanding of compound sentences, adverbials of time and emotive language. We have also learned the spelling rules for adding the suffixes -ful, -ness, -less and -ment. Our focus in computing this half term across school is digital skills. Therefore, in year 3, we have learned how to change the type and colour of the font, as well as the size of font in Microsoft Word. In science, we tested the permeability of a variety of rocks, ensuring we conducted a fair test, making predictions and recording our observations in a table. Finally, in RE, we wrote a recipe for a happy family. The children created some beautiful work of which they should be extremely proud.

Year 4

This week in Year 4 we have enjoyed reflecting on our Roman trip, Using what we learnt in Chester to take part in discussions and to enhance our written work. In Maths we are working hard on our times tables as it is so important for us to know them fluently. In science we are lucky that we can make the most of our outside areas, including the allotments where we studied the different life forms as part of our topic on Living Things. In English we have been enjoying different poems and short stories which we have been reading aloud, practising intonation and expression.

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Year 5

This week we have looked at rounding in our maths and have found fun and interesting ways to test our understanding.

We have begun to watch the Extinction BBC documentary by David Attenborough in English and have worked on the dangers facing many animals.

In RE we have researched the life of Oscar Romero and wrote reports on the amazing life he led.

Year B

We've had another busy week in Year 6! In maths, we have been working with negative numbers. We have ordered, compared and even added and subtracted numbers below 0. We have been continuing our work on Romeo and Juliet focusing on using a range of fronted adverbials. The children are becoming fantastic at varying sentence lengths and types within their writing!

In RE, we read the story of the Prodigal Son and analysed how artists portrayed each character. We have continued our work on Ancient Greece in history. Both classes have looked at how primary sources help us understand the past, especially the early Greek olympics. 60F have learnt about democracy in Ancient Greece- 6HG can't wait to complete this lesson next week! 60F have been practising their ukulele skills are are thoroughly enjoying their music lessons whilst 6HG have been working towards creating their own game in computing!
