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A MESSAGE FROM MR LAVIN CONTINUED...

As mentioned, this is phase I of a much bigger plan. Completing the project in phases is the most practical, and cost effective way

Each fundraiser you have take part in has gone towards the project, as well as investment from the school budget. Without your support, children would not have the playground they deserve so a big thank you, and to the PTA, for your support so far. Phase 2 is to update the playground markings that we currently have. Children will have the opportunity to decide what they would like. We hope to complete this phase by the end of the academic year.

COVID-19 Procedures around school

This week, Senior Leaders / Governors have reviewed the current arrangements to the beginning and the end of the day and we have decided to make some important changes. Please do take the time to read the information below.

Start of the school day

We will be continuing with the current morning arrangements for now. As a school we find this a much smoother way to the start of the school day. Also, we love being at the front gate in the mornings to say 'Hello' to children and parents. However, we will be making a time change. From **Monday 1st November**, all gates will **open at 8:40 am** and will **close at 8:50am**.

Children will sanitise their hands when they enter the classroom to help the flow of children coming through the gate. All children after this time will need to go to the main school office and will receive a late mark. Our current arrangements are meaning there is a real delay to the start of teaching. Registration will officially begin at 8:50am with lesson one of the day beginning at 8:55am. A prompt start of the day is so important and I hope you support us in this change.

End of the school day

This information below is for Years 1 to 6. The current arrangements for Nursery and Reception will remain in place.

From **Monday 1st November**, we will return to the pre-COVID way of children being collected; children can be collected from their classroom doors. Your child's class teacher will email you directly to explain where their classroom is if you are unfamiliar with the layout. **The end of the school day is officially 3:15pm**.

The gates will not open for you to come onto the site until **3:10pm**. The site gates will close again promptly at **3:25pm**. This is because each night we use the playground and field for after school club and after school sports. We believe reverting back to this system will allow for stronger lines of communication between parents and teachers. Year 6 children will be allowed to walk home alone from 3:15pm.

I know these arrangements may not suit everyone, and some really like the way it is currently, however we do need to strike a balance. As always, we will give this a go, and review the procedures if necessary.

Nursery

We have completed our first half term! I am so proud of how well the all the children have settled in to our routine and love our learning. Our story this week has been Room on the Broom. We turned our indoor water area in to a witches' potions area, with a Halloween theme. We made lots of potions with spider and eyeballs! Our sensory tuff tray had potion making things too, lots of great sharing and language used in these areas. We have enjoyed learning our nursery rhyme of the week and our number song - make sure you practise at home!

The children enjoyed their bike ability session again this week, they are getting practising using their skills on the balance bikes.

The children had PE on Thursday this week with Mr Grantham and had lots of fun going on the adventure playground. Finally, we had our Forest school session with Mrs Artingstall. Every week we feed the chickens and ducks, collect leaves, herbs and flowers for our mud kitchen. Emmeline wrote us a letter to say she had lost her hat, again, and could we help her find it! We are good at finding her hat! We have been carving and exploring pumpkins and making potions in the outdoor area. Enjoy your half term.

Reception

What a busy and exciting week we have had in Reception Class! We have enjoyed reading "Funny Bones" and drawing the funny skeleton family. We have made pumpkin slime and pumpkin soup by mixing different ingredients together. We talked about the different smells and textures. We made our own fizzing potions and made our own spells. The children have had an amazing first half term!

We have been making plans to work more closely with Year 6. All of the Reception children have a special friend who will follow them through their Reception year supporting them in their play and learning. We all went to church with the Year 6 children. Some of the Reception children went to their first school mass supported by their special Year 6 friend. Well done to all and enjoy your half term break!

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Year 1

Another amazing week in Year 1. Our highlights included.

- Art day-learning all about Henri Matisse, and painting in his style with lots of interesting shapes and bright colours.
- Our Autumn walk, discovering all the changes now that Autumn is here.
- Joining in with an author reading and "draw along" for our book "Look up!" We drew and wrote about the cat from the story.
- Solving a maths problem about putting bottles of strawberry and chocolate milk in a milk crate, finding all the possibilities. (This helped to apply our skills with number bonds to 6)
- Listening to a story that we share with the Jewish people- how Abraham and Sarah trusted God and travelled far.

Year 2

Year 2 have had a fantastic week! We have completed our History topic of The Great Fire of London and we have learnt how firefighting has changed from 1666 to present day. We have also completed our Art topic and have experimented with colour mixing and using charcoal. We had lots of fun (and got very messy!) and have produced some wonderful, realistic paintings of fire.

For Black History Day, we are learning about Bob Marley and we have written our own verses to "Three Little Birds". I'm sure the children will be singing them all through half term! Miss Leigh and Mrs Healey are so proud of how hard the children have worked this half term and we hope they enjoy their well earned rest.

Question: How has firefighting changed from 1666 to present day?

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Year 3

This week we have focused on our History topic in Year 3, learning about Neolithic farming, Skara Brae, Stonehenge and Iron Age Hillforts, as well as being hunter-gatherers. The children were very inquisitive, with fantastic questions and an endless enthusiasm for their learning. In Design Technology, we designed, planned, baked and evaluated Iron Age bread. The tasting of the Iron Age bread had mixed results in class, with some children loving the taste, whilst others were less impressed. As part of black history month, we learned about Malorie Blackman - a famous black, female author and children's laureate from 2013 - 2015. We designed a book front cover in the style of her most famous books (Noughts and Crosses and Check Mate), produced a fact file about her life and were inspired by the poetry in her book Cloud Busting. It has been a very busy and enjoyable half term. We cannot wait to learn about the human body in Science and compare Manchester to Thessaloniki in Geography next half term.

Question – Why were Iron Age hillforts so successful at protecting Celtic tribes?

Year 4

As part of Black History month, Year 4 explored the presence of racism in football, reading news articles and watching clips from Newsround. We discussed recent incidents surrounding Euro 2020 and how social media has contributed to footballers being racially abused. The children then wrote a newspaper article on the subject for the First News newspaper.

Miss Scaife's class enjoyed their last drumming lesson this week. Mrs Bilic's class will start their sessions next half term with Miss Scaife's picking it up again after Christmas.

In our Art lessons we have been researching and designing Roman mosaics, learning about how and why they were made and the types of designs which were created. The children have loved copying intricate designs as well as creating their own.

This week we learnt about how important The Torah is in Judaism. We couldn't believe that every scroll was handwritten with no mistakes allowed! We made our own scrolls which focused on one aspect of the Torah, writing guidelines for how to live a good life.

Question: What language is The Torah written in?

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Vear 5

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Year 5 have had an excellent final week of this half term. We have now completed our letters regarding extinction and a sample of them will be sent to Angela Rayner in due course.

Additionally, we have thoroughly enjoyed continuing with our space unit and produced some highly effective artwork depicting the Earth and Moon. This week has also been a particularly special week as both classes have taken part in an RE retreat and we have also been studying the importance of the Passover for Jewish people.

Finally, we have concluded our week with 'break the rules day' and completed a 'Black History day'. Throughout the day we have explored the Windrush generation and created our own Notting Hill Carnival masks. Have a wonderful and safe half term Year 5.

Year B

This week has been an extra special week in Year 6 because we have met our special friends from Reception. We are looking forward to spending time with our Reception buddy and helping them on their learning journey. Testerday, some of us went to Church with our special friend and some of us stayed in school. All the Reception and Year 6 staff were impressed with the Year 6 children's care and kindness towards their Reception friends. Year 6 we are so proud of you!

In 6HG this week, the children have had a day of learning about Ancient Greece and how democracy has changed since this time period. 6DF have began their computing lessons and handed over their ukuleles to 6HG ready for next term.
