The children will be spending time in class preparing for the birth of Jesus. These are the following Advent topics the children will be covering:

Reception and Nursery: Birthday - Looking forward to Jesus' birthday

Year 1: Waiting - Advent: a time to look forward to Christmas

Year 2: Preparations - Advent: preparing to celebrate Christmas

Year 3: visitors - waiting for the coming of Jesus

Year 4: Gift - God's gift of love and friendship in Jesus

Year 5: Hope - Advent: waiting in the joyful hope for Jesus, the promised one

Year b: Expectations - Jesus born to show God to the world

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Our Fantastic Learning!

Nursery

We have had another fun week in Nursery.

We have been practising our Nativity and we are very excited for you to come and watch with us next week.

We have been learning about Hanukkah, the Jewish Festival of Light, and we enjoyed making Hanukkah crafts.

We have also been learning about Advent and how it is a journey to prepare for the birth of Jesus. We spent time learning about the colours of the candles and what they represent.

On the snow day we had hot chocolate and toast to keep us warm and cosy.

Reception

What an eventful week we have had! The excitement of snow, opening advent calendars and the return of the elf. We have been busy learning songs for our Nativity performance. The children are doing so well and looking forward to performing for you all.

In class we have been exploring the Christmas story. The children have listened attentively and will be able to tell you all about it. We have also enjoyed reading Stickman and talking about our families.

In mathematics we have been finding different ways of making 5.

We are very proud of the children and all that they are achieving at this busy time.

Year 1

Year I have had a very busy week indeed. We are practising hard for our Christmas carol concert and we have done an amazing job of learning all our words. In maths we are learning all about number ten. We are getting really good at our number bonds. We have also enjoyed playing maths board games to help us consolidate our number facts. We acted out a real Baptism on Thursday morning and we learned about the symbolism of water, candle light and chrism in Baptism. On Friday we walked around our school grounds to find locations on a map from an aerial view. We noticed lots of changes.

Year 2

Another week comes to a close and again Year 2 have made their teachers proud. They have completed assessments this week in reading and maths, and taken them in their stride -well done Year 2!

In English this week we have started reading a lovely Christmas themed book called "Little Robin Red Vest" By Jan Fearnley. The children have shown good understanding of the story and have used it as a stimulus to write sentences using the past tense. In maths we have been learning about 2d shapes and their properties.

In RE we are continuing to look at signs and symbols in Baptism and we are thinking about the meaning of Advent. We've also had a great time this week getting ready for our Christmas play - the children can't wait to wow you with their singing, dancing and acting!

Year 3

In English this week, we have been exploring determiners and writing rules for using 'a' and 'an'. We have also been developing our use of expanded noun phrases, using a thesaurus to identify synonyms and extend our vocabulary. In RE, we looked at the life of St Stephen, who was a contemporary of the apostles, and became the first martyr to be made a saint. We began our Advent celebrations and used the travelling Nativity to share reflections and prayers in our daily collective worships. Using IPads, we researched information about Thessoloniki, which we will use to produce travel leaflets in Geography. We particularly focused on the climate, historical sites, activities, Greek food, landmarks, restaurants and accommodation. In Maths, we applied our knowledge of the multiplication and division facts for the three times tables to word problems and reasoning activities. Next week we will be using acrylic paints in Art and exploring the artwork of the famous Japanese artist (Katsushika Hokusai. 1760 - 1849).

Year 4

As we entered the first week of Advent, we have started getting ready for the arrival of the baby Jesus. We've thought of ways in which we can follow in Jesus' footsteps through our words and actions. The children have made Advent promises and asked for God's help to become the best version of themselves and help others, especially during this time.

We have also been very lucky to have a visit from Mrs Farmer who delivered a retreat day based on Advent. Both classes thoroughly enjoyed the day's activities and all children participated with enthusiasm and respect.

Year 5

In Year 5 this week we have researched the famous bridges within Manchester in our D&T lessons. In English we have planned and written our own chapter 13 from our class novel 'Room 13'. In maths we have concluded our subtraction unit of work. We have investigated separating materials in science through the use of different objects. In RE we have looked at the importance of marriage and the vows and promises that are made at these important life events.

Question- what are the 4 types of separation we have learnt about this week?

Year B

This week in Year 6 we have enjoyed continuing with Wonder. We have read an extremely emotional chapter called, 'The Bleeding Scream'. We spent a lot of time reflecting upon Auggie's feelings in this chapter and thought about how the words we use impact on a person's self perception and mental health. We re wrote this chapter from Jack Will's point of view: thinking about if he meant some of the comments he said.

In Maths, we have continued with our topic on multiplication with a challenging investigation where we had to apply place value and multiplication knowledge. As we prepare for the Birth of Jesus during this season of Advent, we have completed our RE topic on Vocations. We have learnt about the Sacrament of Holy Orders and have researched the various roles Nuns play within the Church. At home, please continue practising times tables using TTRS and reading on Myon as often as possible!
