


RSE

RSE

Module One: Created and loved by God

Nursery	The children will learn about what makes them special and unique. They will learn to name body parts (heads, shoulders, arms) and describe themselves using positive language.
Reception	The children will explore how their likes and dislikes will be different to their friends. Through books and visuals, the children will learn to name emotions and discuss what makes them feel a certain way.
Year I	The children will further develop their understanding of feelings. The children will talk about big feelings they have and explore how they can act upon these feelings.
Year 2	In Year 2 the children will use scientific vocabulary to name body parts. The children will discuss how to keep their bodies healthy.
Year 3	The children in Year 3 will talk about emotions they feel. The children will look at how they can articulate their emotions clearly. The children will also reflect upon being thankful.
Year 4	In Year 4, the children will begin to learn about puberty and the physical changes that are happening to their bodies.
Year 5	The children in Year 5 will build upon their understanding on puberty in Year 4 and look in depth and changes that happen to boys and girls. The children will learn about spots, sleep and keeping healthy.
Year b	In Year 6, the children will further explore the physical and emotional changes that take place during puberty. The children will learn about the life cycle of a human.

We have been completing lots of different problem solving activities in Maths involving time and the children showed great resilience when doing this. We have also been learning about the treatment of women before and after the suffragette movement and how World War I contributed to women getting the vote. Year 3

This week, in year 3, we have been analysing the thoughts and feelings of a range of characters in our text 'The Bear and the Piano' before planning and writing a diary extract from the viewpoint of the bear. In Maths, we have used patterns and relationships to predict further equivalent fractions and make generalisations. We have also compared non-unit fractions, identifying similarities and differences. In RE we completed our unit of work on Journeys by planning and conducting a collective worship to celebrate our learning. In History, we have compared the Indus Valley, Ancient sumer and Ancient Egyptian civilisations, using a Venn diagram to present our findings. This week we have also worked hard on our Moving Monsters in D & T. We have designed and decorated our monster's heads and bodies, created accessories and incorporated pneumatics into our models. Throughout our making stage we have continually evaluated and amended our plans to achieve the greatest possible outcomes. We can't wait to share our finished results!

Question - Can you write 5 equivalent fractions for 1/5? What relationships do you notice? Why?

Year 4

This week, Miss Scaife's class did a fantastic assembly where they showcased lots of their classwork, including their Kennings.

We started a new English unit based on the wordless picture book, 'Journeys,' which contains detailed images which fire the imagination. The children inferred and predicted what might happen in the story. We are looking forward to delving into it in depth after the half term holiday.

On Thursday we took part in Tameside Virtual Book Festival. The author Josh Lacey spoke to us about the books he has written including the Hope Jones books. He gave us tips about writing and stressed how important it is to keep improving our work until it is our very best.

In Maths we continued working on fractions, in particular ordering fractions and equivalent fractions.
