

Nursery

A beanstalk grew in our nursery this week! We even found Jasper climbing it as he looked for giants. We have been drawing and listening for initial sounds in words this week.

In maths we have been learning about number 5 and representing 5 in different ways.

We were very lucky at the allotment too as we saw lots of frogspawn and planted some peas.

Reception

We continued our work with the book Lulu Loves Flowers this week. We have loved exploring our new Flower Shop in our outdoor area. We made bouquets for our friends, made lists of flowers and lists of what flowers need to survive. We continued our learning indoors and went on to paint pictures of daffodils using chalks and pastels. We have been labelling parts of a plant and learning the names of each part and its function.

We have visited the allotments this week to investigate the difference between a seed and a bulb. We also enjoyed feeding the chickens too! In mathematics we have been measuring using the scales and the tape measures in our numeracy shed in the outdoor area.

This week we made our own obstacle course outside. We focused on balancing, hopping and crawling.

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Year 1

We have missed some of our year I team (both children and adults) who have been poorly this week. Take care, and we hope you all recover quickly. Despite this, lots of fabulous learning has been going on. Some highlights were:-

- Writing our own story about meeting Blip (the main character from unplugged)
- Applying our addition skills to puzzles and problems. We imagined that we went to an ice cream shop and worked out the price of an ice cream with toppings.
- Learning about the capital cities in the UK, and the 4 points of the compass.
- Finding out about mammals.
- Celebrating St. Patrick's day and making cards.
- Improvising our own 3 note tunes on the glockenspiels.
- Finding out about William Morris and copying some of his patterns.

Question: Can you spot any mammals this weekend? How can you tell it is a mammal.

Year 2

Year 2 have been working hard this week across the curriculum. In Maths we have been consolidating our understanding of fractions and are now learning to find 3/4 of an amount. In English we have been busy developing our writing skills and extending our vocabulary by using a thesaurus. We used our exciting adjectives to write similes. We also wrote some lovely descriptions of Pandora's world before and after she met the bird.

We have come to the end of our topic on Emmeline Pankhurst and the Suffragettes and the children have shown great interest in their learning. We have started a new topic on Plants and have been investigating plants that we can eat. In RE we are continuing to learn about different elements of the Mass, this week we focussed on the Holy, Holy prayer.

Ask your child to tell you about Emmeline Pankhurst and the suffragettes.

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Year 3

Our RE Retreats this week were amazing! Mrs Farmer discussed the sacraments of Baptism and Reconciliation and their significance to us as Christians. We explored different ways to pray: through song, meditation and analysing psalms. The children worked together to create a mosaic cross, as well as writing 'sorry' prayers and creating flames which link to Pentecost. In History, we identified questions about the lifestyle and diet of Ancient sumerians, Ancient Egyptians and the people of the Indus Valley, before researching the answers and creating a double-page spread of information. We will now draw our learning together to write a balanced argument, identifying the most successful ancient civilisation and justifying our opinions. In English, we wrote our own recipe for marvellous medicine, practised past and present tense and retold a chapter of the book as a comic strip. Although we had to cancel 3LW's assembly due to pupil absence, we hope to reschedule in the next couple of weeks. We will keep you updated.

Question - Name 3 things you have learned about the lifestyle of the Ancient Sumerians?

Year 4

We started this week with an investigation into how sound travels through solids, liquids and gases. The children set up six different experiments, including using a speaker to observe the way the vibrations, created by the music's bass, affected the sugar.

Towards the end of the week, we began studying our new text 'Macbeth'. The children took part in a 'Whodunnit' in which they were given clues to help them predict who murdered the character, Duncan in the play. In Maths, we have been learning about decimals and linking this to our knowledge of fractions.

Question: What did the sound waves from the speaker do to the sugar and why?

Year 5

This week has seen us come to the end of units in both English and Math. We have finished off our English focus of 'Chak de India'. The children have been so immersed and engaged within this topic and the work produced throughout has been fantastic. It has been so much fun teaching a unit where the children have been so excited to learn. In math we have now completed our division unit and have moved on to fractions. This week the learning has been around equivalent fractions. This unit of work has a lot more to cover, but the children have made a great start. Two bits of fraction homework will be coming home each week to really ensure that the understanding is strong. In History, we have continued our focus on 'The Tudor's'. We have analysed the different diets of rich and poor Tudors and compared this to today's modern society. One thing the children all seemed to agree on was that not having a McDonalds or Nando's in Tudor times would have been hard to take!

Year B

Another week has flown by in Year 6! In Maths, we have worked hard on converting fractions, decimals and percentages. This has been a challenging unit of work but the children have shown great perseverance. In English, we have continued to read extracts of Anne Frank's diary and we have been writing our own diary entries as sara from our text White Bird. We are looking forward to starting our new text next week: The Island.

In History, we have learnt about how Hitler came into power. We imagined we were a German citizen and wrote letters to an English

cousin about our feelings about the new Chancellor. 60F enjoyed their final art session with Sam this week. Sam will be returning in two weeks to complete 6HG's session.
