Parents are invited to attend. Plan 1 will be for parents from Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 to gather on the playground after drop off. Children will then parade their bonnets on the playground for all to see - if the weather is bad, we will go to plan 2. We will inform you the day before when we know more about the weather!

Nursery

What a fabulous week in Nursery we have had. We have continued work on our book 'Jasper's Beanstalk'. We have been exploring what we think is up the beanstalk and making our own stories up. We have been working hard to write our names and write some initial sounds too. We had a lovely PE session with Mr Grantham and Bikeability session with Joe. We went on our Wednesday Welly Walk down to the allotment.

Question? What do you need to do to look after a seed?

Reception

We have had another busy week in Reception class. The children have loved the spring walks as everything around is changing every week. The book that we are reading at the moment is called Bloom by Anne Booth. It is a beautiful story about a little girl, a flower and an old man. The children's listening skills are fantastic. Ask them about the story.

We are learning new vocabulary such as pollen and nectar as we continue to learn more about the importance of bees and plants. This week we chose a flower to dissect and label.

In mathematics we are learning about doubling. We enjoyed the story of The Napping House where we noticed number patterns.

We were also lucky enough to see 'Mad Science' in action in school this week.

Year 1

What a busy and fabulous week it has been in Year 1! Mrs Delafield's class started the week with a trip to the library. Don't worry, Miss Bacigalupo's class, it's your turn next week. Remember, bring your library card if you have one. It has also been Shakespeare week. We have been listening to "A Mid-Summer Night's dream." We acted out part of the story, made our own fairy magic potions and explored art and music about the story. We imagined our very own dream in a magical forest. In maths, we have been improving our subtraction skills and applying them to solving problems. In Science, we went to see what had happened to the frog spawn in the pond. We expected to find tadpoles, but it was a very cold day, and we could not find any. Perhaps they were hiding.

Question: What do you think will happen next in our pond area?

Year 2

This week Year 2 have completed their remaining assessments and worked very hard. As part of Shakespeare week, we have looked at "The Tempest" and have focused on writing a detailed character description of the monster Caliban. In maths we are revisiting multiplication and division. This week we looked at how knowing one fact can help us find others. Keep working with your child on learning their tables for rapid recall!

In geography we have been locating Continents and oceans on a map. We enjoyed using google earth to explore the different continents and oceans.

In RE we have started our topic on opportunities and how Lent is a great time to explore opportunities for doing good.

On Wednesday we enjoyed our visit to Droylsden Library, the children were a credit to you and our school. Thursday started with an inspiring Science assembly - Year 2 thoroughly enjoyed the show and have taken home letters about an upcoming after school club run by the Mad Science team.

Can you name the seven continents and five oceans?

Year 3

As part of Shakespeare Week in English, we read and analysed Twelfth Night. We produced a description of the island of Illyria, planned and wrote a news report and created a summary of the story.

In Science, we classified food in different ways and became dieticians, creating a meal suggestion for a vegan, an athlete, a child with a dairy intolerance, a boy with Celiac disease and an elderly woman with diabetes. We had to take into account their daily calorie intake, as well as special dietary requirements. In Maths, we matched tenths to their decimal equivalent and used images to describe what we noticed. In PSHE, we talked about the Zones of Regulation and identified tools to help us regulate our mood. Next week we are looking forward to our library visits.

Question – What should a person with Celiac disease avoid in their diet?

Year 4

As always, Year 4 have been working hard this week and have had lots of success in their learning. Continuing our work on decimals, the children are becoming more confident in identifying equivalencies, reading and writing decimals, and comparing tenths and hundredths. In D&T, we are working towards designing and making our own bags. In preparation for making their own product, the children having been practising the running stitch and the overstitch. We have been very impressed with their resilience and skill! Watch this space for some budding designers.

This week, we have been treated to some fantastic assemblies. One was from CAFOD and they spoke to us about all of the amazing work that they do to help others. They have tasked us with coming up with some ideas for fundraising; the school council will be discussing our suggestions at their upcoming meeting. Another exciting assembly was delivered by Scientific Sarah at Mad Science. She demonstrated some amazing experiments based on getting a rocket to Mars. The children learnt all about different forces, the power of rocket fuel, centripetal force and aerodynamics. If your child is interested in carrying out more exciting experiments like these, Mad Science will be delivering an after-school club which begins after the half term.

Question of the week: Can you explain the four zones of regulation?

Year 5

This week in Year 5 has been full of exciting things. In English it has been Shakespeare week and our book of choice was 'A Midsummer nights dream.'. The children have been so engaged and immersed in it which is fantastic! I'm sure they can tell you all about it. In maths we have looked at adding and subtracting fractions. In Art we have moved on to our new unit of work focused on the art of Lowry. The children have researched his life and imitated some of his most well known artistic elements. Both year5 classes also had a trip to the local library. They were brilliantly behaved and really enjoyed it. Sign up forms are available from school if your child requires one to join.

Year B

We were extremely upset in Year 6 when our trip to the theatre was cancelled on Tuesday however, we are very excited for our rearranged date next week! Drama is going to be a theme in Year 6 next week as we have our Romeo and Juliet workshop on Tuesday.

This week in school we have been focusing on finding fractions and percentages of amounts in Maths and in our morning booster sessions we have revised different aspects of shape. In English, we have been continuing to read 'The Island' and we have been planning, writing and editing monologues from the point of view of one of the characters.

In History, we used immersive software to learn about what life was like in the Blitz. Using an interactive story, we acted out the life of a child in the Blitz. Thank you Mr Lavin and Mrs Taylor

for helping us do this! We were amazed to learn that children still went to school during this period of history!

6HG had their last Arts Award session this week which mean both classes have finished their 'Staying Safe' art project. This has been a fantastic opportunity for the children and they have produced some fantastic pieces of art. A big thank you to Sam for coming in to teach Year 6! We are going to miss our sessions!

6DF had a wonderful trip to Droylsden library this week and 6HG are looking forward to visiting next week.
