Newsletter

Nursery

This week it has been all about the chicks in our Nursery. We have learnt about what we need to do to take care of animals. We talked about ensuring they have enough food, water and exercise, and the importance of keeping their environment clean. We have watched them carefully and talked about their behaviour, also noticing the changes in how they look in such a short space of time. In Mathematics this week, we have been comparing height, deciding who is taller and who is shorter. We have been measuring ourselves, working out how many construction blocks tall we are. In the forest this week the children wanted to look for minibeasts. As we were exploring, we noticed some litter and talked about why it is damaging for our wildlife, then collected it and binned it.

Reception

This week we have been looking at the story of Christopher's Caterpillars. In the story Christopher loses his 6 caterpillars and then finds 6 butterflies. We have enjoyed making lost and found posters.

Our caterpillars are growing fast! We have watched them grow that bit more each day and we are excited to watch them transform into a cocoon ready to become butterflies.

Tameside Music Service visited us in school this week and we had a special assembly. We were introduced to a variety of different instruments. We were fascinated with the music they played for us. Ask your child what instrument was their favourite.

We have turned our role play area into a cafe. We have been getting it ready this week ready for its grand opening next week!

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Newsletter

Year 1

Year 1 have been very busy this week! A huge highlight was a special assembly from Tameside Music Service, who showed the children a variety of instruments and played us some songs. The children were very engaged and inspired. In English, we have been looking at some poetry to link with our new story 'The Day the Crayons Quit' and we created our very own colour poem. In Maths, we continue our work on adding and subtracting numbers, looking at related addition and subtraction facts to 20. In History, we compared Victorian school rules to St Stephen's school rules and discussed what is the same and what is different. In Science, we have been looking at what different animals eat to survive and how animals can be grouped according to what they eat. As Pentecost approaches, we have explored different symbols of the Holy Spirit in R.E and recognised that Jesus sent the Holy Spirit as a helper. In Computing, the children enjoyed programming Beebots to turn left and right, as well as predicting where the BeeBots would travel after programming different sequences of instructions. In our D&T unit, we have designed a sandwich and planned how to make it.

Year 2

We are so proud of Year 2's hard work, resilience and determination this week. In English, they have been generating their own exclamation sentences and writing a diary entry from the perspective of the badger or the sandwich, re-telling the events of The Disgusting Sandwich. In Maths, the children have been revising concepts taught so far this year and applying different methods. In R.E, the children wrote beautiful prayers thanking God for the gift of the Holy Spirit. The children have completed lots of Geography work this week including making a circle book to compare the continents and they have learnt about the importance of the oceans and how we can protect them. The children enjoyed a fantastic music assembly on Thursday and they have spent lots of time in the sunshine!

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Newsletter

Year 3

This week, we enjoyed a lovely Mass in Church on Thursday. All of the children sang beautifully and the readers were very clear. We also had the pleasure of welcoming the Tameside Music Service into school for a special assembly. The children loved finding out about the different instruments and were thrilled by the music performed by the musicians. In English, we planned and wrote a diary entry from the viewpoint of Rhodopis and changed sentences into the present perfect tense. In Maths, we assessed subtraction calculations to identify the most efficient method: mental calculation, number line or a formal method. We then completed the calculations using the chosen method. We have also continued to practise formal decomposition methods to secure our understanding. In RE, we learned about Pentecost and created interviews for the Apostles, whilst, in French, we wrote phrases to describe Summer.

Question – Why was it important for the Apostles to speak in different tongues?

Year 4

This week, Year 4 have been busy practising for their times table check test by playing loop games, beat the clock games and doing practice exercises on I-Pads. The children are keen to challenge themselves and are gradually improving their speed and accuracy.

On Thursday we enjoyed a music assembly provided by Tameside Music Services. It was great to see and hear different musical instruments like the cello, the saxophone and the drums. The team explained the different pieces of the instruments and had us guessing the different tunes they were playing. It was great fun and made us all want to start learning a musical instrument.

We have finished off making our bags in D & T. All the children showed patience and determination when learning to thread a needle and use the appropriate stitching. We finished the bags off by designing an image or pattern to decorate our bags. Everyone is proud of their creations.

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Year 5

Year 5 have had yet another great week!

In English, we have been continuing to write our balanced arguments surrounding Philippe Petit. The children have worked hard to write formally and present a balanced viewpoint.

Within Maths, the children have been finding a fraction of an amount by completing both fluency questions and word problems.

On Thursday, during assembly, the children enjoyed an engaging performance by the Tameside Music Company. They were introduced to a range of different musical instruments which they thoroughly enjoyed!

Finally, in Geography, the children have continued to explore lines of longitude. They have focused more closely on the equator and its impact on the climate of different countries.

Question: How do you find a fraction of an amount?

Year B

We've been busy bees this week in Year 6! We have continued with our text about Cicada (which we are loving!) and have researched Cicadas in the wild. We used this information to write an informative leaflet about Cicadas; aimed at people who are fans of David Attenborough. Did you know that Cicadas burrow underground for 17 years during their nymph stage?

In maths we have been learning about the difference between discrete and continuous data. We have explored different ways of representing data and have chosen the most suitable way to represent a range of data.

Our Science lessons this week have focused on the life of Charles Darwin. We have learnt about his life and the research he undertook. We explored some of his theories of adaptation and linked this the investigation we did regarding different bird beaks. We have started to prepare for Pentecost in RE. We have thought about how the disciples were witnesses of Christ.

We are extremely excited for PGL next week!
