#### Assessments

Children will take part in a variety of activities that relate to Science and Sports and I am sure it will be really exciting. Children can wear their school PE kit all week. 

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# NEWBLETTER

## Nursery

It has been all about water this week in nursery. We shared ideas about the different uses for water, then read our new book, The Flying Bath. We have bathed the babies, washed clothes and been using different containers to pour in the water tray. In Mathematics, we have been learning about weight. We made our very own balance scales and compared the weight of different objects. At the allotment we were amazed to see that some of the tadpoles have finally grown their legs. We watched the froglets for a long time, hoping to see more. We also planted sunflower seeds and watered them.

## Reception

It was wonderful to welcome you all back on Monday. We launched into our under the sea topic. We were amazed by how much the children already knew about life under the sea.

We released the butterflies! Such excitement! They all found their way to the flowers that the children placed especially for them. The visit from the Creepy Crawly Show was amazing! We had stories, learnt new information and experienced seeing and holding creatures first hand.

We opened the Jubilee Cafe in our role play area. Such a busy fun filled week back.

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# NEWSLETTER

### Year 1

Year One were very excited to receive a letter from the Queen this week!! Her Majesty loved our hat creations and letters we sent a few weeks ago after reading 'The Queen's Hat'. The children have been completing their phonics screening check this week and have worked so hard. The results from these will be sent home with reports next month. In English, we have started our book 'Meerkat Mail', beginning with writing a character description of Sunny and writing a reply to his postcards. In Maths, we have begun our unit on multiplication and division, introducing arrays and repeated addition to represent multiplication. Please help your child count in 2s, 5s, and 10s at home to support their learning. In Science, we have introduced our topic on plants and discussed what the children already know. In computing, children explored digital painting by drawing their faces on paint software. We have introduced our new R.E unit 'being sorry' and are looking forward to exploring this unit further.

### Year 2

Year 2 have had a great first week back after half term! We have been continuing to learn about the Titanic and in English, we have been reading 'Story of The Titanic' to support this. The children have empathised with the passengers on the ship and described their emotions at the different stages of the journey. They have started to write their own diary entry, imagining that they are a child on board the ship. The children have ordered the events of the Titanic onto a detailed timeline and used this knowledge to support the chronology of their diary entry. In Maths, we have been looking at statistics and we have recorded and interpreted data on pictograms and bar charts. The children have had a fantastic week and they are excited to participate in lots of activities for Science and Sports Week next week.

## **Year** 3

This week, we have begun our text 'Escape From Pompeii' in English. We analysed the text to identify information about everyday life in Pompeii and wrote from the perspective of a fisherman in the Bay of Naples during the eruption of Mount Vesuvius. This links well into our Guided Reading text 'The Pebble in My Pocket', which tracks the life of a pebble over 480 million years from the viewpoint of a young girl who finds it on a beach. Through this text, we were able to learn about the formation of mountains, valleys and continents, as well as the evolution of animal species. In Maths, we are using dienes and place value counters to support our written multiplication methods. We will continue to practise our formal methods, applying our understanding to reasoning activities and word problems. In Art this week, we etched simple designs on to a polystyrene tile and used ink to create repeated patterns. We also learnt how to layer colours using printing methods, completing and evaluating a final piece in the style of Andy Warhol. It has been a busy, yet enjoyable, week. We can't wait to enjoy Science and Sports week next week, as well as our poetry festival.

## Year 4

Summer is finally here and we have been enjoying the warm weather. This week, we played rounders in PE - would it be summer without a good game of rounders? The children completed the multiplication check this week. Everyone did their very best and they should be very proud of themselves. In English, we started our new book 'The Day I was Erased'. We have really enjoyed reading Maxwell's story so far and can't wait to see what happens next. In Geography we continued our 'Land Use' topic, studying the different types of maps and using a key to interpret symbols.

Next week, we are looking forward to Science and Sports Week and all the exciting activities.
