



Feast of the Sacred Heart

Today, we celebrate the Feast of the Sacred Heart. This morning our chaplains prepared and led a beautiful assembly explaining the history of this feast day and why it is important to Catholics. Here is some of the information our Chaplains shared:

- The sacred Heart of Jesus represents Christ's love for mankind through his sacrifice on the cross for human sin.
- The Sacred Heart of Jesus is often depicted in Christian art as a flaming heart, shining with divine light, pierced by the crown of thorns. It is surrounded by a cross.
- In 1675, Jesus told St Margaret Mary that he wanted the feast of the sacred Heart to be celebrated in the Friday after Corpus Christi.

Nursery

Sport and Science week really got our bodies and brains working. We have conducted so many experiments with water this week. We found a way to get a pompom from the bottom of a container to the top, without touching it! We have explored floating and sinking, making a prediction then testing many different objects from around the nursery. We tried to work out why some objects floated but others did not. The children have made boats with various materials, then tried them out in the water tray to see whether their boat floated. Some of our boats were great at first, but became soggy and soft after sitting in the water for too long, so we talked about why that would happen. We have been learning about keeping healthy too, talking about the different foods that are good for our bodies. Sports week has been great fun with various team games, Yoga and even PE with an Olympic athlete!

Reception

We have had such an amazing week!! The story we are focusing on at the moment is "Somebody Swallowed Stanley" by Sarah Roberts. Look up the author she is involved in animals and their environments.

This week we have been predicting and testing. We have investigated, explored and taken part in many different experiments. Ask the children to tell you about the coins and the pipettes experiment. We have enjoyed doing our daily mile, PE and yoga.

A fantastic memory was made at the Poetry Festival. It was wonderful to perform our poem to Year 1 and then listen to their brilliant poetry recital.

We finished the week with a bouncy castle. Lots of new learning, exercise and fun! Have a fantastic weekend.

Year 1

What a busy week we have had in Year One! This week was science and sports week. The children took part in many activities to celebrate this. As part of our science topic, 'plants', we began our investigation to support our idea that plants need water, sunlight, and soil to grow. We planted seeds, giving plant A all of the three things it needs to grow and plant B just 2 of the things it needs to grow. We will find out what happens in the coming weeks! The children also did an experiment to showcase at our school science fair. As part of sports week, we were visited by the athlete, Leon Baptise, who shared his road to success and ran a fitness challenge for the children. The children have been completing the daily mile and yoga sessions. We also took part in the outdoor poetry festival, where each class performed part of the poem 'Noisy' by Shirley Hughes to other year groups. Some children even performed their own poems they had written!

Question: What three things do plants need to grow?

Year 2

Science and Sports week has been a great experience! In science we have been completing some of our class curriculum activities on Habitats. The children showed good understanding of why certain animals are suited to their environments. We had fun looking for minibeasts in their micro habitats too. For our science fair project, we made a link with our Titanic work and investigated floating and sinking. Meeting and listening to Leon Baptiste was inspirational and we had great fun taking part in his fitness challenge. Our daily mile has kept us fit this week too. We have explored the great exercise and fitness opportunities our school grounds give us too. For our poetry presentation we focused on a poem called Wings by Pie Corbett. We looked at the patterns and format of the poem to create our own verses and then performed them to our Year 1 classes. We have also enjoyed Now Press Play session on Habitats and Healthy Living. We ended our week with a fun session on the bouncy castle!

Perhaps you could investigate some Microhabitats in your garden.

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Year 3

A wonderful Science and Sports week in year 3! The children completed the daily mile each day, enjoyed yoga and athletics, met Leon Baptiste (a 100m and 200m champion who has even raced against Usain Bolt), completed circuit training and had a wonderful time on the inflatable assault course. In assemblies, we learned about the importance of a healthy diet and exercise on our mental health and wellbeing, as well as how to be more resilient to ensure we achieve our goals. In Science, we completed our work on Magnets and Forces, investigating poles and attraction and repulsion. We also researched, asked and answered questions about Michael Faraday, who was the first scientist to explore electromagnetism. For the Science fair, we planned, conducted and evaluated an investigation into friction, using a range of materials on ramps and measuring the distance travelled. We presented these findings to the rest of the school and helped them to investigate the question for themselves. During the Poetry festival, we recited 'I'm Walking with My Iguana' by Brian Moses and wrote our own poems in the same style. We were able to perform these for 6DF, as well as enjoying their work. A fun-filled, informative, active and educational week!

Year 4

What a busy week in Year 4! We carried out two exciting Science experiments linked to our topic of Teeth and Digestion. The first one involved exploring how damaging different liquids are to our teeth. We used egg shells to observe how a range of drinks affected their colouring. The results were very interesting, The other experiment was fun as we had to eat different flavoured jelly beans whilst wearing a blindfold and holding our nose. It was quite difficult to guess the flavours!

On Wednesday, we were inspired by Leon Baptiste, the amazing athlete who came into school and talked to us about his journey to success, as well as all the challenges he faced on the way. He showed us the importance of being determined and resilient.

On Thursday and Friday we enjoyed performing the poems we wrote based on Maya Angelou's work, 'Caged Bird.' We paired up with Mr Fitch's class to edit our poems then we performed to one another.

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Year 5

Year 5 have had a fun filled Sport and Science week this week. On Monday the children began their next Science unit based on Forces. The children have enjoyed studying Isaac Newton and completed different investigations. The children have shown their perseverance and scientific enquiry, especially when completing the balloon rocket- which didn't necessarily go as planned! The children then presented their experiment and findings to all other classes during a science fair. Additionally, we have been studying the work of the poet Kwame Alexander. They were tasked to choose their own sport to write a poem about, using his style. The children enjoyed sharing their work with a Year 4 class during our poetry festival.

Throughout the week, the children have also been taking part in the Daily Mile; played rounders and enjoyed their PE lessons with Mr Grantham. To their delight, they completed their week having access to a large inflatable to play upon.

Question: What were the constants and variables within our balloon rocket investigation?

Year B

Wow! What a week it has been in Year 6. We are extremely proud of how many children stepped outside of their comfort zone to audition for the Wizard of Oz. All the children's auditions were amazing which made casting parts extremely difficult! Since finding out their roles on Tuesday, the children have been practising for the play with great enthusiasm.

As it has been sports and science week, the children have participated in a range of activities linked to these subjects. We have completed the daily mile, circuit training and played rounders in addition to our usual PE lessons. In Science we have further explored inheritance and adaptation.

In RSHE, we have been talking about peculiar feelings. We have explored how thoughts, feelings and actions are all interconnected by looking at different scenarios involving negative feelings and thoughts. We put a positive spin on the negative feelings and thoughts and explored how the associated action would change.

We have ended this week by participating in a poetry festival. After reading the poem 'New Beginnings' by Tony Walsh, we wrote our own versions based upon our feelings regarding high school.
