

Relics of St Bernadette

On Tuesday, our Year 6 classes had the opportunity to visit Salford Cathedral to venerate the Relics of St Bernadette. This was an extremely prayerful experience with the children writing their own intentions which are going to be taken to Lourdes.



What is a Relic? After a Saint dies, part of their remains can be stored as a relic. Praying near the relics can help us feel closer to God and we can ask the Saint to pray for us, our families and our friends. The relics of Saint Bernadette that visited Salford Cathedral include fragments of two ribs, the saint's

kneecaps, muscle from the right thigh and otr muscle, skin and hair tissue, which are kept in a beautiful reliquary.

Nursery

We have had a wonderful time learning about colours this week. The children painted and mixed colours, thought about and talked about the colour of different objects too. We particularly enjoyed exploring instruments this week. We named different instruments and learnt how to play them, taking turns and listening to each individual sound.

We had a walk to the allotment and forest on Wednesday. Last week we spotted many apples growing, so we decided to take buckets and collect them to bake an apple crumble. The children all took delight in feeding the ducks and chickens again this week too.

This week we have been learning how to subitise amounts to 3. We have also been talking about things that match and things that don't match and why?

We are listening carefully to stories and learning how to answer how and why questions.

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NEWBLETTER

Year 1

Year 1 have had a great week and are really settling into their new routines. We are really pleased with their growing independence in the classroom. This week was our final week of work based on "The Bumblebear" and the children have done a great job of writing sentences using time connectives. In daily phonics we have been working hard on learning new sounds and blending them. Well done to those children who have been reading regularly to improve their fluency. In Maths we have continued to work on place value within 10. We have looked at matching numbers names and digits. We have used ten frames to help us count on from a given number. In RE we continue to learn about family, particularly the Holy Family and have discussed the story of Jesus getting lost in the temple. In history we found facts about our new monarch, King Charles III and watched his proclamation as king.

In our computing lesson we used laptops to practice dragging an object using a mouse. We also learned how to log on and off.

In science we continued our work on the senses, focussing on sight and hearing. We had great fun listening to everyday sound and labelling the parts of the eye.

We have also had a busy week completing our Rainbow Challenges that help us practice and develop our skills across the curriculum.

Year 2

The children have had a great week and produced lots of super work! In English, we have continued our work around The Highway Rat and we have been using adjectives to add more detail in our sentences. We have also been using 'and' as a conjunction to join clauses.

In Maths, we have been deepening our place value knowledge and we have been partitioning 2 digit numbers into tens and ones. We have also learnt strategies to help us to remember how to write numbers to 100 in words.

In History, we have been discussing what London is like today and we have been comparing it to what London used to be like. In R.E, we have been looking at the order in which God created the world.

Year 3

This week we have moved on with our English story of 'Stone Age boy'. The children have been writing 'lost' posters for the main character using detailed sentences. We have used our understanding of different sentence types to make our writing better.

In maths we have continued our theme of place value. The children have been estimating on numberlines.

In History, we have looked at the essential tools that the Stone Age people required to live. The children then sketched a tool of choice.

In Science we have looked at Igneous rocks and how they are formed.

In RE, we did some research on Mother Teresa and created some work on how her actions make us feel today.

Question- what are the 4 sentence types?

Sear 4

As always, the children in Year Four have been working hard to produce some excellent work.

In English, we have been reading 'The Legend of Rock, Paper, Scissors' and this week the children have written some impressive speeches in the role of one of the warriors. They used powerful vocabulary and described their superior abilities. The children really got into character and enjoyed reading them to the rest of the class.

We continued our work on Place Value, placing numbers to 10,000 on a number line and developing our estimation skills.

In RE, we looked at our family trees before studying Jesus' family. We were really interested to learn of the important Jewish figures that Jesus was related to.

Question of the week: What words can you think of with the 'ea' code?

Sear 5

This week, in Year 5, the children enjoyed a wonderful Forest School session. They worked collaboratively in groups to recreate a magic trick from Leon and the Place Between. This will provide them with first hand experiences and vocabulary to use in their final written piece in English.

In Maths, the children have continued to work on the place value of numbers to 1,000,000. They used number lines to position 5 and 6 digit numbers, compared them and began to order numbers.

The children also created timelines of both British and Maya history and marked significant places and monuments on a map of the Ancient Maya. In RE, the children analysed a letter from St Paul to the Colossians and answered questions relating to gifts and talents from God. To begin our Science unit, they identified a range of forces and considered their importance.

Question - How many forces can you name?



Year 6 have had a fantastic week!

We started by visiting Salford Cathedral to see the relics of St. Bernadette. This included a lovely service and an opportunity for us to learn about the amazing story of St. Bernadette.

In Maths, we have been focusing on ordering, comparing and rounding numbers up to 10,000,000. We have also explored the story of Romeo and Juliet. The children have thoroughly enjoyed summarising the story through the use of hashtags, as well as interpreting tweets sent by characters.

Our Guided Reading text (Hidden Figures) focused on four incredible African-American women who were essential in the space race. Their mathematical skills and determination to be successful were even more impressive given the level of discrimination and segregation at the time.

Question: Who appeared to St. Bernadette 18 times?
