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Newsletter -

Nursery

We have been continuing to learn about ourselves this week, identifying and naming parts of our bodies. We have talked about our favourite tastes, smells and also people that make us feel happy. In Mathematics, we have continued to learn about colours, but this week have focussed on sorting objects. We started off sorting by colour and quickly learnt that we could also sort into other categories too. In the forest, we collected leaves and sticks this week, and have used them to collage, adding different natural resources, before making them stand out with paint and glitter!

Reception

We have had another super busy week in Reception! We are really enjoying reading our story "Hello, Friend!" We have been talking about what we like to do with our friends when we are in school and also thinking about how we can help our friends. In maths we have been sorting a variety of objects based on their similarities and differences. We have been looking at size, shape and colour. We have made pizzas this week to help us with our sorting. We have learnt new vocabulary surrounding instructions and following a recipe. We are really enjoying collecting our 'Autumn Treasure' and have been turning our finds into pictures.

Question: Can you find 10 objects from around your home and sort them?

Year 1

Another fantastic week has flown by in year 1! We are particularly proud of how respectful the children were in Church on Thursday - well done! Children have been working hard in all subject areas and are really engaging in our continuous provision to complete their weekly challenges. In English, we have started our new book 'The Queen's Hat'. Children designed their own hats, writing adjectives to describe it and putting these into sentences. In maths, we continue our work on place value. Children have been looking at one more and one less than numbers within 10, as well as counting forwards and backwards. In R.E, we discussed how every family is different and how our families help us to feel safe. Our Science lesson this week was based around parts of the body. Children labelled parts of the body and used their senses in our investigative area. In History, we looked at the reign of Queen Elizabeth I. In computing, children practiced their trackpad skills by drawing a digital painting on the laptops, experimenting with different tools. As part of European Languages Day, we learnt how to say different colours in Spanish!

Year 2

What another fantastic week we have had in Year 2 this week.

The children have been working hard in English, continuing their study of 'The Highway Rat'. In their lessons they have studied both the physical features and personality of the Highway Rat and created a wanted poster. The also attended a brilliant forest school session with a Highway Rat theme.

In Maths, the children have been studying partitioning numbers to 100 and how to partition them in different ways. The children showed great resilience and have used equipment brilliantly to aid their learning.

In Science this week, we have looked carefully at the what a human needs for survival and the children have begun creating their double page spreads.

In Computing, we have considered ICT in the world around us. The children are excited to learn more!

In Music, the children have been finding the beat in our new song, 'Hands, feet heart'. They have enjoyed learning the lyrics and we are sure they will continue to thrive when we add instruments to our composition.

Finally, on Thursday we celebrated our European languages day. The children thoroughly enjoyed learning greetings and numbers in Spanish. They were fully engaged when learning the songs.

Question: What does a human need to survive?

What a brilliant week in Year 3 during which we have focussed largely on languages! As a school we are beginning to teach Spanish and on Thursday we had a Spanish day throughout school. The children really enjoyed dressing up in the Spanish colours and all of the different activities that we did, including researching the county of Spain, singing songs and playing games in Spanish. Thank you to both Julia and Mrs Duffy who did taster sessions with the children in Italian and Spanish. The children absolutely loved it!

In English, we have completed our diary entries written form the point of view of a Stone Age Boy and next week we will begin to write a non-chronological report all about the Stone Age. In Maths, we have just finished our unit on Place Value. The children did a short test today on Place Value and they did really well. In Science, we are enjoying learning about different types of rock and are looking forward to doing a fun investigation into rocks next week!

Question - How many different colours can you say in Spanish?

Year 4

Another very busy week in year 4! It was so exciting to have taster sessions in different European languages. We enjoyed learning how to say the names of different fruits in Italian and in French we were taught how to say and write the colours. We also launched our new language which will be taught in school starting this year: Spanish. We started learning all about cities in Spain. It was quite exciting as some of us have actually been to those places. We also looked at the Spanish artist, Picasso and tried making our own faces in Picasso's style.

We are still practising our times tables every day in school and at home on Times Table Rock Stars. Also in Maths we have tackled Roman Numerals this week. In Science we are learning how to classify living organisms - we started this off in a fun way by sorting biscuits into different groups depending on their features!

Year 5

This week, year 5 enjoyed a wonderful European Languages Day. The children sang Spanish songs, learned some simple Flamenco dance steps, created paintings in the style of Joan Miro (a Spanish surrealist artist) and tasted some traditional Spanish food.

In English, we wrote a setting description for the Place Between, incorporating fronted adverbials, expanded noun phrases and varied sentence openers, as well as a variety of senses. Next week, we will begin our new text - Shackleton's Journey by William Grill.

To complete our place value unit in Maths, we have been working on rounding to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000. We will begin our work on Addition and Subtraction next week. In Science, we researched and created a double-page spread about the life and discoveries of Sir Isaac Newton.

'Livin' on a Prayer' by Bon Jovi is the focus of 5LW's Music lessons. We have appraised the song, identified the pulse and practised singing and accompanying the song, whilst 5ES continue to learn how to play the cornet.

Question: In how many different languages can you say 'Hello'?

Year B

We've had another busy week in Year 6! Both classes led beautiful assemblies this week; it was lovely to see so many family members and friends in the audience!

This week in English we have explored the characters from Romeo and Juliet in depth. We have chosen powerful adjectives to describe the characters and we have justified our ideas using evidence from the text. In Maths we have 'rounded' off our place value unit by rounding and exploring negative numbers. Both Mrs Gibson and Mr Fitch were extremely impressed with the children's understanding of negative numbers! We have loved beginning Spanish this week! We spent some time learning about Spain and locating cities on a map and learnt basic greetings through a Now Press Play experience.
