

Nursery

We have had a wonderful week in nursery exploring the outdoors and talking about Autumn. We have threaded leaves, investigated lots of different Autumn treasures and sorted them into different groups. We started reading the story, Pete the Cat loves his white shoes. We made our own story map about the book and are able to retell the story using it, using the repetitive phrases. We enjoyed drawing Pete using circles and lines, and painting him using watercolours. We changed the colour of his shoes and thought about different fruits that he could step in.

Well done for a great week, Nursery!

Reception

We have had a lovely week in Reception. We have been busy sounding out and blending CVC words in phonics.

It was baby's first birthday in our house, so we have been making cakes, banners and having our own tea parties. In Literacy, we have been thinking about the different feelings the characters might feel in our story "Hello, Friend!" We wrote "I am" sentences and tried to hear, say and write the initial sound of a feeling. We have also been trying hard to write our name by ourselves! In maths we have been comparing lots of different things: sizes, length and height. We can use the new words we have learnt such as big, little, long, short and tall.

Well done, Reception! You've been fantastic!

Near 1

Year 1 have had a really productive week. They have immersed themselves in this weeks challenges, which have been based around our story of "The Queen's Hat" and our history topic of Monarchy. We have built palaces in construction and even created a new crown for King Charles.

We continue to work hard on our reading and writing through our phonics and English sessions. This week we wrote sentences to explain where the hat had flown to and some children were able to sequence sentences using time connectives such as first, next, then and finally. For National poetry day we enjoyed looking at rhythm in "The Song of the Train" by David McCord.

In maths we have been comparing numbers using less, than greater than and equal to. We have been learning to use the correct mathematical symbols of > ,< & =.

In history we looked at the life of Queen Victoria and together created a factfile for our history display. In science we consolidated our understanding of naming body parts in our continuous provision.

In computing we have been learning about the keyboard and how to type and save a file.In RE we have completed our unit of work on the Holy Family.

TALK ABOUT THE BODY AND ASK YOUR CHILD TO NAME THE BODY PARTS

Vear 2

Year 2 have been working extremely hard this week! We have been writing our own narratives in the style of The Highway Rat and the children have produced some fantastic pieces of writing! In Maths, the children have been comparing objects and numbers using greater than and less than symbols. In PSHE, we have been talking about the importance of talking to someone about our worries and the children created their own worry monsters about these. To end the week, we have been celebrating National Poetry Day by performing some poetry using expression and actions and the children have written their own descriptive poems all about themselves!

Question: What is meant by the symbols < > and =? Can you write a number sentence including these?

Year 3

We have had another lovely week in Year 3! In English the children have begun writing their non-chronological reports all about the Stone Age. On Monday they researched the topic using IPADs before sharing their ideas and beginning to write their reports. We are looking forward to reading the completed reports next week! Thursday was also National Poetry Day. We all really enjoyed listening to the poem "I'm walking with my Iguana" by Brian Moses and then writing our poems in this style. Next week, we will have the opportunity to perform their poems for another class.

In Maths we have started addition and subtraction. The children are showing increasing confidence in adding multiples of 10 and 100. We have also enjoyed two great assemblies this week. It was lovely to celebrate the work that the children did during European Languages Day, with each class sharing some Spanish work that they had done.

Question: How do you say 'How are you?' in Spanish?

Year 4

This week, Year Four enjoyed some lovely assemblies. The first from Mrs Williams' class, whose rendition of Bon Jovi's 'Living on a Prayer' had us all singing. The second was held by Mrs Shuttleworth and gave us a chance to showcase the work we did during International Languages Week. It was a real pleasure being able to see all of the fabulous work the other classes had done. In Maths, we were learning to interpret roman numerals. The children were amazing at this! 4DS learnt a song with actions to help them remember. They have been enjoying it so much that some spent wet playtimes writing them down and when giving in their house point total at the end of the day, did so in roman numerals.

On Thursday, we celebrated International Poetry Day in school. Year Four studied the poem 'The River' by Valerie Bloom. The poem used repetition and personification to convey the characteristics of a river. We then wrote our own poem about another geographical feature, in this style.

Question: What sorts of things did slaves do during Ancient Egypt?

Year 5

This week, in Year 5, 5LW performed their class assembly. The children were wonderful, sharing their work and explaining what we have been learning in class. It was fantastic to see so many parents, friends and family to celebrate with us.

On Thursday, we enjoyed a fantastic assembly, where all the classes in KS2 shared their work from European Languages Day. Thursday was also National Poetry Day. In class, we analysed 'The British' by Benjamin Zephaniah. We identified the themes of diversity, equality and justice in the poem and commented on the use of a recipe format. Using his poem as inspiration, we produced our own poem about St Stephen's. We are very proud of the results and aim to publish some examples on the website in the coming weeks.

In Maths, we have been using formal addition and subtraction methods for numbers up to 1,000,000, as well as identifying when a mental method would be more efficient.

Finally, in History, we learnt about the writing of the Maya: glyphs, logograms, syllabograms and codices. The children deciphered logograms and created one of their own, as well as answering questions by hunting for facts.

Question: Why were logograms so important to the Ancient Maya?

Year B

This week Year 6 have been focusing upon the initial meeting of Romeo and Juliet in English. We have analysed the text version and watched clips from the film thinking about similarities and differences between the two. We revised fronted adverbials as a grammar focus this with and took great care in ensuring the correct placement of commas.

In Maths we have moved onto addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. We revised the column method for addition and subtraction and completed some challenging missing number problems.

We are coming to the end of our class novel: White Bird. This is a graphic novel that recounts the life of Sara, a young Jewish girl who was kept safe by a kind family during WW2. This week, we have felt joy, relief and heartbreak whilst reading the text and the children have participated in mature discussions about the Holocaust.

Question: Do you think Juliet would have approached Romeo if he did not approach her?
