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Homework

As promised, please find, over the next two pages, an overview of the Homework Policy for after the half term break. I have held discussions with senior leaders and staff regarding what they feel is best, what is manageable for children, but also we considered family life too. Things may change as the weeks progress, but below is the whole school expectations. You can find the full policy located on our school website.

EYFS

Reading - Read Write Inc sound sheet (Phonics), Ditty or word book and read for pleasure

Handwriting - letter formation and number formation.

Maths - Weekly White Rose maths cards

Year 1 and 2

Reading:

- 10 to 15 minutes of their Phonics Book Book change will be on a Monday and Thursday for children in Year 1 and 2 who are on Read Write Inc Scheme (up to Yellow Group). Children in Yellow, Blue and Grey will be changed once a week on a Thursday. Those off the scheme in Year 2 will move onto AR Reading Scheme (parents will be notified of this)
- Individual phonics teachers may send home sound sheets or ditties to practise at home.

Spellings:

 Weekly spelling lists will be emailed on a Tuesday and tested on the following Tuesday.

Handwriting and Number Formation

 Worksheets will be sent as needed (Class Teachers will speak to those parents involved).

Arithmetic Activity:

 Weekly activity will be marked and sent home on a Monday and the same activity will be repeated on a Friday in order to improve your child's score.

Numbots (Times Table Rockstars for Year 2 later in the year):

 We recommend your child spends at least half an hour over the week, to fit around other activities.

Occasionally, your child will have projects based around other curriculum areas, this will be emailed by the class teacher.

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Year 3 and 4

Reading:

- We encourage 10 to 15 minutes of reading each night **Spellings**:
 - Weekly spelling lists will be emailed on a Monday and tested on the following Friday

Arithmetic:

 Weekly arithmetic activities will be marked and sent home on a Monday and the same activity will be repeated on a Friday in order to improve your child's score.

Times Table Rockstars:

• We recommend your child spends around 10 minutes per evening where possible

Times Tables (weekend homework):

 Mad Minutes activity sent home each Monday. Children will have 3 minutes to complete as many multiplication and division questions as possible. This will be repeated in school the following Friday to identify progress in speed and accuracy

Occasionally, your child will have projects based around other curriculum areas, this will be emailed by the class teacher

Year 5 and 6

Reading:

 We encourage 10 to 15 minutes each night. In addition, the children in Year 5 and 6 will receive a weekly comprehension on a Monday to be returned the following Friday.

Spellings:

• Weekly spelling lists will be emailed on a Monday and tested on the following Friday.

Arithmetic:

 Weekly arithmetic activities will be marked and sent home on a Monday and the same activity will be repeated on a Friday in order to improve your child's score.

Times Table Rockstars:

We recommend your child spends around 10 minutes per evening

Times Tables (weekend homework):

 Mad Minutes activity sent home each Monday. Children will have 3 minutes to complete as many multiplication and division questions as possible. This will be repeated in school the following Friday to identify progress in speed and accuracy







Nursery

In nursery this week, we have been reading Winnie the Witch stories, recognising that there is a cat in these books too, just like in Pete the Cat. We have identified the characters and role played by making our own potions and magic spells. The children have thoroughly enjoyed making silly spells in the cauldrons, adding all sorts of wonderful things and listing them. In the outdoor area we looked for sticks and used them to make wands and broomsticks, which the children then used in their play. In maths, we have continued to extend patterns and have been trying really hard to make our own repeating patterns, using natural objects from around the nursery.

A wonderful end to our first half term. Well done, Nursery.

Reception

We have really enjoyed the last week of our first half term in Reception! In maths, we continued our learning about pattern. We made repeating pattern fruit kebabs! We have also been thinking really hard about numbers 1, 2 and 3 and what makes up those numbers. We are trying our best to show different ways to make those numbers for example 2 and 1 make 3 and 0 and 3 make 3. In English we have continued to think about how Sam Squirrel feels in our story. We have been focusing on simple words such as Sam, sad, red and mad and trying to blending those words together verbally and in our writing.

We had a lovely time at our 'Special Friends' mass with our Year 6 friends. We are already looking forward to our next visit to church. Thank you to everyone who could join us in church.

Thank you also to the adults who attended parents evening, it was lovely to chat with you about how well we are doing in class. If you did not manage to attend and would like a meeting, then please see our teachers on the door.

After the half term we are excited to be starting a new topic all about magic.

Year 1

What a busy and productive half term Year 1 have had! The children have been a credit to you in the way they have adapted to their new classes and it was a pleasure to share their hard work with you at our Parent /Teacher Meetings.

This week in English we have been focussing our work around the story "Coming to England" by Dame Floella Benjamin. It describes her journey from Trinidad and has helped the children consider the lives of others during Black History month.

In maths we have been using part part whole models to create addition equations, at times this has been challenging but the children have persevered in their learning. We have concluded our topic on Monarchy by creating a timeline of the monarchs we have studied.

In science we have been discussing how we keep our bodies healthy and keep them moving. In Computing we have continued to practise our keyboard skills, retrieve a saved file and learned about E-Safety. We have also have great fun singing our songs in Charanga and being active in our PE lessons. We wish everyone a great half term.

Ask your child to name the monarchs we have been learning about.

Year 2

What a fantastic last week of term the children have had! In R.E, the children have engaged in their Judaism unit and learnt about the celebration of Shabbat. They have completed their first History topic of Year 2, The Great Fire of London, and this week they have explained why the fire spread so quickly, how firefighting methods have changed since the 17th century and how London was rebuilt after the disaster. In Science, the children have learnt about the importance of exercise. Miss Leigh and Miss Seville are so proud of the progress the children have made this half term and it was fantastic to share this with their parents last night. Have a fantastic break!

Year 3

As it is Black History Month we have combined our English and History lessons this week. The children have really enjoyed researching and finding out more about Marcus Rashford and Mary Seacole. They then used the information to create some amazing acrostic poems and fact files. We have now finished The Stone Age Boy and will be moving onto our new class story, The Dark by Lemony Snicket, after the half term.

In maths we have moved on to more formal methods of addition and subtraction. The children have all done really well at presenting their calculations correctly and have worked well in pairs helping one another. We will continue with this work after the half term with children adding and subtracting two digit and three digit numbers.

In Art we have created artwork depicting Stonehenge, using pastels for the background and card to show the stones themselves, which the children enjoyed.

We have made it to the end of the first half term in Year 3! We would like to say a huge well done to all of the children for all of their hard work!! Have a wonderful week off with your families.

Year 4

This week we continued our work on The Lost Happy Endings. To support our writing, each class took part in a Forest Schools activity. We collected materials from around the forest and made our version of the witch's face. Using this as inspiration, we wrote a description and included metaphors and similes.

In their assembly on Wednesday, 4DS got the chance to showcase some of the lovely work they've been doing this term. The children had great fun and did such a wonderful job! Without doubt, their favourite part was performing the Roman Numerals song for everyone.

As part of Black History Month, we studied the issue of racism in professional football. We read articles from the past few years and had some important, thought-provoking discussions. The children then wrote their own newspaper article, highlighting the problem and encouraging people to join the fight against racism.

As we come to the end of a busy half term, we would like to say well done to the children for their hard work and hope that they enjoyed their week off.

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Year 5

The final week of the half term has been an extremely busy and enjoyable one. Both 5LW and 5ES enjoyed a fantastic retreat day with Mrs Farmer. The theme of the day was friendship. The children prayed, meditated and sang hymns together, as well as painting images to represent friendship, writing 'sorry notes' for their friends and relatives and analysing religious art and scripture.

As part of our work for Black History month, we learned about the Windrush Generation and the influence of Caribbean culture on the Notting Hill Carnival. We designed masquerade masks and produced a diary from the viewpoint of one of the Windrush Generation arriving in Britain.

In English this week, we learned about the fate of the Endurance (Ernest Shackleton's ship). We wrote in role as a member of the crew and used the present perfect tense in our work. After the holidays, we will be writing a balanced argument exploring the arguments 'for' and 'against' leaving the safety of the camp.

In Maths, we completed our unit on addition and subtraction, comparing calculations and finding missing digits in balancing equations. It has been a fantastic half term. We are sorry to have to say goodbye to Mr Swinnen but are also looking forward to welcoming Mr Winn into our year 5 family.

Year B

This half term has flown by in Year 6! To quote one of our Year Six Pupils this week, 'Year 6 goes really fast!' The children have all made an amazing start to the year and deserve a well deserved break next week!

We completed our work on Romeo and Juliet this week by writing letters from the grave. The children chose which character they wanted to write as, who the letter would be addressed to and also the purpose of the letter. We had some amazing letters of explanation, apology and even some threatening letters of revenge! Fantastic work Year 6!

We have continued our work on multiplication this week and we explored both square and cube numbers. Next term we will be working upon long multiplication and long division methods. This week we have celebrated Black History Month in school. We focused upon the positive work of Muhammad Ali in class thinking in particular about how he was an activist for civil rights in America. The children made fantastic links to the work we did previously in the term in Guided Reading when we read Hidden Figures and even related themes to those within White Bird. A highlight of the week in Year 6 was our special Mass with our friends in Reception. The children were outstanding role models and showed great compassion towards the younger children. Well done Year 6!


